



Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. Can Christians blaspheme Allah? **A. Answer by Catholic Answers:** Christians should remember that "Allah" is the name of God in Arabic and so is a divine name that Arabic-speaking Christians such as *Maronite Catholics*, and not only Muslims, use. Consequently, out of respect to both God and Muslims, Christians should not misuse the name of Allah (see the Catechism 2142-67). In contrast, Christians can express legitimate criticism of Islamic doctrine regarding God, including Muslim disbelief in the divinity of Jesus Christ, but they should make that criticism constructively, i.e., without showing disrespect to God per se and needlessly alienating Muslims.

SUMMERY OF THE LAST PAC MEETING - At the past Meeting on Monday, June 12, members of the Parish Advisory & Financial Council met with our pastor. Highlights discussed: (1) The 2017-2018 ECF Religious Education Program will officially commence on Catechetical Sunday, September 17. We are inviting both Parishes for a tentatively scheduled social trip to the Pittsburgh Zoo in Sept/Oct; (2) Contining to look into contractors to refurbish the Church basement bathrooms sponsored by the Pirohi Project, and to seek bids for remodeling the gym restrooms; (3) Looking for contractors to give bids on re-routing School roof drains by diverting rain water to outside sewer sources as to Boro ordinances; (4) Replace old wooden unsteady ladders leading to bell tower with aluminum ones; (5) Rework our contract from Waste Management for trash elimination every other week due to rise in costs for weekly service; (6) Plans for the July 4 Independence Day Divine Liturgy & Cookout on the premises as well as the Annual Church Picnic in Robinson Township on August 20.

SUMMERY OF THE LAST PAC MEETING - At the past PAC Meeting on Tuesday, June 13, members of the Parish Advisory & Financial Council met with our pastor. Highlights discussed: (1) In reviewing several cost proposals to eliminate our Honey Bee problem on the left side of the roof, it has been decided to contract "B-Control of Dormont to set a trap to capture the bees rather than exterminate them. This will be a two months process, and then to seal the entrance where they gather; (2) Replacing the large frosted glass in the rectory fover area that was accidently broken by the last residents. It has been reported to the insurance company. The \$500.00 deductible will be handled by the Seminary as per our agreement. Some of the new residents will be moving in beginning at the end of June. They are a Ukrainian seminarian and possibly a Ukrainian priest with his family. Details still in the works. This agreement by the seminary will be help keep utility costs low since we will not be responsible for rectory utilities; (3) The Church recently received the first part of a \$6,000.00 gift from the Stanley Lubinski Estate. This amount has been subjected to a 10% Cathedraticum tax to the Chancery. The amount has been deposited into the Holy Ghost Archieparchial Parish Savings and Share Program to accrue 2% interest with no further tax on the interest. A thank you note will be sent to the Estate upon the reception of the 2nd part of the gift.

THE SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Come, follow me! (Matthew 4:18-23)

The second Sunday after Pentecost shows us the practical application of the



great call to renunciation formulated by Jesus in the gospel for the first Sunday. The gospel proclaimed at today's Divine Liturgy tells of the calling of the first apostles. On the shore of Lake Galilee. Jesus sees Simon and Andrew fishing. He says to them: 'Follow me'. He wants to make them fishers of men. 'And they straightway left their nets, and followed him'. Further on Jesus meets James and John, also fishermen, in the

company of their father, Zebedee. Jesus calls them. 'They immediately left the ship and their father, and followed him.' The new disciples abandoned their nets and their ships: Jesus sometimes asks us to renounce our profession, our instruments of work, whatever we possess. But some sons, at the call of Jesus, abandon their father too: sometimes he wants us to abandon family affections, human friendships, created love. This is not a purely negative attitude. Jesus' call has a very positive aspect: one must follow the Master. But the first apostles could not have followed the Master if they had not first of all left their ships, and their nets, and their father. And what have I abandoned in order to follow Jesus? What does he want me to leave?

Solemn Holy Day this Week — June 24 Nativity of St. John the Baptist

The Gospel (Luke 1: 5) relates that the righteous parents of Saint John the Baptist, the Priest



Zachariah and Elizabeth (September 5), lived in the ancient city of Hebron. They reached old age without having children, since Elizabeth was barren. Once, when Zachariah was serving in the Temple at Jerusalem and saw the Archangel Gabriel, standing on the right side of the altar of incense. He predicted that Zachariah would father a son, who would announce the Savior, the Messiah, awaited by the Old Testament Church. Zachariah was troubled, and fear fell upon him. He had doubts that in old age it was possible to have a son, and he asked for a sign. It was given to him, and it was also a chastisement for his unbelief. Zachariah was struck speechless until the time of the fulfillment of the archangel's words. Elizabeth came to be with child, and fearing derision at being pregnant so late in life, she kept it secret for five months. Then her relative, the Virgin Mary, came to share with her own

joy. Elizabeth, "filled with the Holy Spirit," was the first to greet the Virgin Mary as the Mother of God. Saint John leaped in his mother's womb at the visit of the Most Holy Virgin Mary and the Son of God incarnate within her. Soon Elizabeth gave birth to a son, and all the relatives and acquaintances rejoiced together with her. On the eighth day, in accordance with the Law of Moses, he was circumcised and was called John. Everyone was amazed, since no one in the family had this name. When they asked Saint Zachariah about this, he motioned for a tablet and wrote on it: "His name is John." Immediately his tongue was loosed, and Saint Zachariah glorified God. He also prophesied about the Coming into the world of the Messiah, and of his own son John, the Forerunner of the Lord (Luke. 1: 68-79). After the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ and the worship of the shepherds and the Magi, wicked king Herod gave orders to kill all male infants. Hearing about this, Saint Elizabeth fled into the wilderness and hid in a cave. Saint Zachariah was at Jerusalem and was doing his priestly service in the Temple. Herod sent soldiers to him to find out the abode of the infant John and his mother. Zachariah answered that their whereabouts were unknown to him, and he was killed right there in the Temple. Righteous Elizabeth continued to live in the wilderness with her son and she died there. The child John, protected by an angel, dwelt in the wilderness until the time when he came preaching repentance, and was accounted worthy to baptize the Lord.

ORIGINS OF FATHER'S DAY- A driving force behind the establishment of the integration of Father's

Day was Mrs. Sonora Smart Dodd, born in Creston, Washington. Her father, the Civil War veteran William Jackson Smart, as a single parent reared his six children in Spokane, Washington. She was inspired by Anna Jarvis's efforts to establish Mother's Day. Although she initially suggested June 5, the anniversary of her father's death, she did not provide the organizers with enough time to make arrangements, and the celebration was deferred to the third Sunday of June. The first June Father's Day was celebrated on June 19, 1910, in Spokane, WA. In 1966,



President Lyndon Johnson made Father's Day a holiday to be celebrated on the third Sunday of June. The holiday was not officially recognized until 1972, during the presidency of Richard Nixon.
