



#### Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. My wife and I have been married fifteen years. We are both lapsed Catholics and both were previously married. My marriage was annulled, hers was not. What is our current standing in the Catholic Church? Can we join a parish? Can we receive Communion? A. Answer by Catholic Answers: You most certainly can join a parish and attend Mass (Divine Liturgy). But until you have your marriage validated in the Church, you would be unable to receive Communion. If her ex-husband is deceased, then you could simply have your marriage validated right away. If her ex is still living, she would need to receive a decree of nullity (i.e., an annulment) before you could validate your marriage.

# Baptism originally termed 'Holy Illumination' and "Enlightenment" — (first read John 9: 1-

The methodology of the actual cure of this man born blind in today's Holy Gospel



symbolizes mankind's means for its recovery from its blindness. It symbolizes the Holy Mystery of Baptism. Baptism is called 'holy illumination". Those who have been recently baptized are referred to as the newly illuminated. As this man is cured of his blindness when he washes in the waters of the pool of Siloam, as Jesus tells him to do, so are we brought out of darkness into a new life when we are baptized as Christ instructed

us to be. Jesus restores his creation, mankind, with the potential to become what it was meant to be before the fall of Adam. We also hear in the reading that after this man was cured many of those who knew him before did not recognize him. He is still the same man but something has significantly changed about him. He is no longer blind. So when we are illuminated we are also new persons, though our outward appearance might be the same. To symbolize this newness a white garment is put on us to show the purity with which we start this new existence. We must however, become different and unrecognizable in our inward and outward actions also. We must manifest our new existence to those around us through these actions. We must radiate this new found light to others by the way we live our lives. We must say to the world "I am he who was blind but now my eyes are opened." Credit must be given to Him who has cured us of our darkness by living our lives according to the lessons of the illumination we have received and the continued guidance we get with the reception of the Holy Spirit.

# **Ascension Thursday This Week**

This week's Feast of the Ascension (HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION) reminds us

that our true destiny lies in God. We must not only do what Jesus commands us, but we must follow him to the place where he has gone. The *Feast of the Ascension* tells us that our life is not limited to life on earth, but after our death we will experience a new life in heaven, and even now we are being pulled by the strings of God's love towards our encounter with him. # Saint of the Week — May 22 Bishop-Martyr Basiliscus of Comana

The Holy Martyr Basiliscus was a nephew of the Great Martyr Theodore the Recruit



(February 17), and he suffered together with his brothers Eutropius and Cleonicos during the persecution of the emperor Maximian Galerius (305-311). The holy martyrs Cleonicus and Eutropius (March 3) were crucified, but the martyr Basiliscus was sent to Comana where he was detained in prison. Basiliscus in prison prepared himself for his impending ordeal. The Lord appeared to him in a dream, promising the martyr His help, and foretold his martyric death at Comana. Basiliscus asked the prison guards to let him go to his native village to bid his relatives farewell. They let him go, since they respected him for his holy life and working of miracles. Arriving home, Saint Basiliscus saw his family one last time, and urged them to stand firmly in the Faith. When

Agrippa learned that Basiliscus had gone to see his relatives, he went into a rage. He chastised the prison guards, and he sent a detachment of soldiers after the martyr. Meeting Basiliscus, who was actually on his way back, the magistrianum placed heavy chains on him, and shod him with metal sandals with nails driven into the soles, and set off to Comana. Arriving at a certain village during the hot afternoon, the travelers stayed at the house of a woman named Troana. The soldiers went into the house to relax and refresh themselves with food, and they tied the martyr Basiliscus to a dry tree. The earth shook, and a spring of water came forth from the fissure. The magistrianum, the soldiers and Troana, rushed out of the house. Shaken by the miracle which had taken place, they set the martyr free. Sick people from the village came to the holy martyr and received healing through his prayers. When the saint finally stood before Agrippa, he was commanded to offer sacrifice to the pagan gods. He replied, "I offer to God a sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving every hour." They led him into a pagan temple. In an instant fire came down from Heaven, which burned the temple, and reduced the idols to dust. Then in a blind rage Agrippa gave orders to behead Basiliscus and throw his body into the river. The death of the martyr occurred in the year 308.
