Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. My aunt wants to keep her husband's cremated remains on a shelf in her living room. Is this in keeping with Church teaching? **A. Catholic Answers Apologist:** No. The (U.S.) Bishops' Committee on Divine Worship says the following: Any catechesis on the subject of cremation should emphasize that the cremated remains of a body should be treated with the same respect given to the corporeal remains of a human body. This includes the use of a worthy vessel to contain the ashes, the manner in which they are carried, the care and attention to appropriate placement and transport, and the final disposition. While cremated remains may be buried in a grave, entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium or even buried at sea, the practice of scattering cremated remains on the sea, from the air, or on the ground, or **keeping cremated remains in the home of a relative or friend of the deceased are not the reverent disposition that the Church requires.** The cremated remains of the body may be properly buried at sea in the urn, coffin, or other container in which they have been carried to the place of committal. God Invites all to the Wedding Banquet

(Matthew 22: 1-14)

In today's parable of the Wedding Banquet, the Father has prepared for His Son a

wedding, and the Father sends out servants to invite people to attend this great occasion. He sends out servants with invitations not just one time, but three times, and the responses are varied. The first group of servants is simply ignored; the invited are not willing to come. The second group of servants is mocked, and some of the invited just leave and go back to their business, and others take the servants and abuse them and even kill them. The final group is sent to a different audience—instead of a select few being invited to the wedding, these servants are sent on the highways to



invite anyone they might see. And finally, the wedding hall is filled with guests. We find ourselves, obviously, to be in the final group. The king has called everyone, but even then, to attend, there are expectations! The guests are expected to be properly attired. *This one man had not worn his wedding garment*. The Church Fathers tell us this lapse is so terrible because the Host/the King had provided the wedding garments for his guests to wear. He has no excuse not be dressed and ready for the wedding. The wedding garment is our baptismal robe, and all that goes with it: The purity of our lives, having died to the old man and being clothed in the new man, being clothed in Christ. Once we say "yes" to Christ, there are expectations. If you love Me, Christ says, keep My commandments. We're expected not to just continue doing whatever we want to do, but we are expected is to take up our Cross daily and follow Christ wherever He may lead us. If we just keep doing whatever we want, and live in mortal sin, we're still the master in our lives. We'll be just like this man who arrived at the wedding but didn't have his wedding garment. It would be a horrible thing to discover that the invitation was open to all (as it is), but that we had not prepared ourselves to be welcomed into the heavenly kingdom

Pope Comments on the "Doors of Mercy"

Dear Brothers and Sisters: A bishop, the other day, told me that in his cathedral and in



other churches he had made entry and exit doors of mercy. "Why did you do this?" — "Because one door is to enter by, to ask forgiveness, and to receive Jesus' mercy; the other is the door of mercy to exit by, in order to take mercy to others, with our works of mercy". This bishop is intelligent! Let us also do the same with the journey that goes from the heart to the hands: let us enter the church through the door of mercy, to receive the forgiveness of Jesus, who tells us: "Arise! Go, go!"; and with this "Go!" — on foot — let us leave through the exit door. It is the Church

going forth: the journey of mercy which goes from the heart to the hands. Make this journey!

Saints of the Week

The Holy Martyrs Adrian & Natalie – Aug. 26

The Martyrs Adrian and Natalie were married in their youth for one year prior to their martyrdom, and lived in Nicomedia during the time of the emperor Maximian (305-311). The



emperor promised a reward to whomever would inform on Christians to bring them to trial. Then the denunciations began. Adrian, the head of the praetorium, watched as Christians suffered with such courage for their faith. Seeing how firmly and fearlessly they confessed Christ, asked: "What rewards do you expect from your God for your suffering?" The martyrs replied: "Such rewards as we are not able to describe, nor can your mind comprehend." St Adrian told the scribes, "Write my name down also, for I am a Christian and I die gladly for Christ God." The scribes

reported this to the emperor, who summoned St Adrian and asked: "Really, have you gone mad, that you want to die? Come, cross out your name from the lists and offer sacrifice to the gods, asking their forgiveness." St Adrian answered: "I have not lost my mind, but rather have I found it." Maximian then ordered Adrian to be thrown into prison. His wife, St Natalie, knowing that her husband was to suffer for Christ, rejoiced, since she herself was secretly a Christian. She hastened to the prison and encouraged her husband saying: "You are blessed, my lord, because you have believed in Christ. You have obtained a great treasure. Do not regret anything earthly, neither beauty, nor youth (Adrian was then 28 years of age), nor riches. Everything worldly is dust and ashes. Only faith and good deeds are pleasing to God." They tortured St Adrian cruelly. The emperor advised the saint to have pity on himself and call on the gods, but the martyr answered: "Let your gods say what blessings they promise me, and then I shall worship them, but if they cannot do this, then why should I worship them?" St Natalie did not cease to encourage her husband. She asked him also to pray to God for her, that they would not force her into marriage with a pagan after his death. The executioner ordered the hands and the legs of the saints to be broken on the anvil. St Natalie, fearing that her husband would hesitate on seeing the sufferings of the other martyrs, asked the executioner to begin with him, and permit her to put his hands and legs on the anvil herself. They wanted to burn the bodies of the saints, but a storm arose and the fire went out. Many of the executioners even were struck by lightning. St Natalie took the hand of her husband and kept it at home. Soon an army commander asked the emperor's approval to wed St Natalie, who was both young and rich. But she hid herself away in Byzantium. St Adrian appeared to her in a dream and said that she would soon be at rest in the Lord. The martyr, worn out by her former sufferings, in fact soon fell asleep in the Lord.

HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION THIS PAST WEEK — Last Monday, Aug. 15 was THE FEAST

OF THE DOMMITION OF THE MOTHER OF GOD and a Holy Day of Obligation. The Canon Law of our Byzantine Catholic Church states: "The Christian faithful are **bound by the obligation** to participate on Sundays and feast days (Holy Days of Obligation) at the Divine Liturgy" (Canon 881#1); and "are recommended to receive the Divine Eucharist on these days ..." (Canon 881 #3); "and should abstain from those labors or business matters which impede the worship to be rendered to God" (Canon 881 #4). Neglectful fulfillment of this



precept renders one guilty of mortal sin, therefore, unworthy to receive the Holy Eucharist, until one makes a worthy sacramental Confession of this voluntary neglect.

PILGRIMAGE FOR THE HOLY YEAR OF MERCY, TRIP II NEXT WEEK — To extend an

opportunity to receive the special Jubilee Indulgence, our HGCs are organizing a car pool to Franciscan University, Steubenville, OH, Christ the IUBILEE OF MERCY
