Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. I know that suicide is a grave sin. What happens to the soul of a suicidal person? Do they go straight to Hell, or do they still get a chance to repent? And what happens to the soul of a person with a mental disability commits suicide? A. Answer by Catholic Answers: Although, considered in itself, suicide is a mortal sin, and one which, on the face of it, one may find it difficult to repent of, no one but God knows the state of mind of the person who commits it. If he's not fully responsible for his decision, being mentally disturbed, God may not hold him guilty. Nor is it impossible that God may grant the grace of repentance in the last moment, after the suicidal act has been committed, and yet the soul hasn't yet departed from the body. In either case, whether the soul goes to hell would depend on the person's spiritual condition at the time of his irresponsible act.

THIS PAST WEEK AT THE VATICAN

Pope: Christian life is a struggle, because the Father draws us to Jesus but "another pulls us the other way"

"Jesus came to destroy Satan! To destroy his influence on our hearts. " "If you want



to go forward," you have to fight! Feel the heart that struggles, because Jesus will win. " "We ask the Lord to be Christians who are able to discern what's going on in our heart and choose the right path on which the Father draws us to Jesus."

Vatican City (AsiaNews) - Christian life is a struggle, because "when the Father draws

people to Jesus, there is another who pulls us in the opposite direction and sparks an internal war" and if you want to go forward, "you have to fight! Feel the heart that struggles, so that Jesus will win", said Pope Francis at the Eucharistic Liturgy this past Thursday morning in Santa Marta.

Pope: the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity "makes us think about Christ's love that urges reconciliation"

Vatican City (AsiaNews) - Pope Francis has invited everyone to pray "that all Christians will return to be one family" in his greetings addressed in almost every language to the groups present at the general audience. Francis wanted to remember last Wednesday's start of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, which, he said in Italian, "this year makes us reflect on the love of Christ that urges reconciliation." The motto of the week, he commented "is a challenge for us: The love of Christ impels us toward reconciliation. We pray to the Lord - he added - that in every Christian Community, aware of their history, theology and law be ever more open to reconciliation. May a spirit of goodwill and understanding pervade, as well as the desire to work together.

During last Sunday's Angelus, Pope Francis said that "The Church, in every age, is called to do what John the Baptist did - show Jesus to the people." The Church proclaims Christ; it does not bring itself; it brings Christ. Because it is He and He alone who saves His people from sin, delivers them and guides them to the land of true freedom. The Holy Father then prayed: "Virgin Mary, Mother of the Lamb of God, help us believe in him and follow him."

Saints of the Week THE VENERABLE XENOPHON AND MARY AND THEIR SONS JOHN AND ARCADIUS

January 26

They were prominent and wealthy citizens of Constantinople.



Xenophon and his wife Mary lived a God-pleasing life and dedicated all their attention to the Christian upbringing of their sons. When their sons reached majority, they were sent to study in Beirut; but it so happened that a storm capsized their boat. By the Providence of God. John and Arcadius were somehow saved. They were tossed ashore by the waves but in two different places so that each thought the other was drowned. Out of grief for each other, they both became monks in two different monasteries.

After two years, their grieving parents came to Jerusalem on a pilgrimage to pay homage before the holy shrines. There, with the help of the "discernment" of a spiritual father, first the brothers met and, after that, the parents with their children. Out of gratitude to God, Xenophon and Mary distributed their entire estate to the poor and both of them were tonsured. The history of these four souls is touching and it shows how the Lord wonderfully guides the fate of those who believe in Him; how He permits pain and sorrow upon them that they may, later on, be strengthened in faith, in order to lead them into still greater joy. They lived and died in the Lord in the fifth century.
