

#### Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

**Q.** If Mary was born without original sin and did not sin during her life, does that mean that she did not need to be saved by Jesus? **A. Catholic Answers Apologist:** Christ's death on the cross was an eternal event; as such, its graces could reach back in time, as well as forward. This means that the grace that Christ would win on Calvary could be applied to Mary in anticipation of Calvary. This was how she was saved from any stain of sin, both original and actual. Medieval theologians created the analogy of two people approaching a pit. If the first falls in and is rescued from the pit, and the second is prevented from falling into the pit, both are saved, and it even could be said that the one whose fall was prevented is saved far more completely than the one who was raised from the pit.

## THE HOLY THEOPHANY FEAST

## **Sunday after the Enlightenment**



We are currently in the postfestive period of Holy Theophany, and it is




designated to be a continuation of Our Lord Jesus' Baptism and the revelation of the Holy Trinity. This Sunday is referred to as the "Sunday after the Enlightenment." This designation comes from the early Church from the Holy Mystery of Baptism which was referred to as the "Enlightenment." It was the usual practice to administer baptism or the enlightenment on the Theophany Feast since Jesus' own baptism was being commemorated on this important feast day. At that time catechumens who were prepared for their initiation and admission into the Church received baptism, chrismation and eucharist on that day.

Therefore, this Sunday calls us to reflect on the importance of one's own baptism, and how its relevance and personal effect have called us to be God's new chosen people. What a privilege that has been bestowed upon us! We have been satiated with Jesus' Light, and have partaken of the sanctified Jordan Water. We have been invested with Christ Himself. It is a time to ask ourselves if we have been living in accordance to His teachings and witnessing to His very presence. Our Faith goes far beyond being personal. It is to be shared with all that we come into contact with. Are you reflecting the joy of this event which promises us heavenly glory or are we like others who are depressed and saddened by the negative events that surround us? During this special year of Faith, take this Sunday's celebration to heart and recommit yourself to Christ since He promises eternal life and great mercy.

## The (Church) Fathers Know Best

The Early Church Fathers believed that being baptized was being born

again. They baptized both adults and infants and they used three methods; immersion, pouring and sprinkling. Tertullian: "No one can attain salvation without baptism, especially in view of the declaration of the Lord, who says, "Unless a man shall be born of water, he shall not have life" (On Baptism 12:1 [A.D. 203). Origen: "The Church received from the apostles the tradition of giving baptism



even to infants. The apostles, to whom were committed the secrets of divine sacraments, knew there is in everyone innate strains of [original] sin, which must be washed away through water and the Spirit" (Commentaries on Romans 5:9 [A.D. 248])



### **Saint of the Week**

## Our Father among the Saints, Gregory, Bishop of Nyssa — January 10

Saint Gregory, Bishop of Nyssa, was a younger brother of Saint Basil the Great (Jan. 1). His birth and upbringing came at a time when the Arian disputes (those that didn't



accept Jesus as God) were at their height. Having received an excellent education, he was at one time a teacher of rhetoric. In the year 372, he was consecrated by Saint Basil the Great as bishop of the city of Nyssa in Cappadocia. Saint Gregory was an ardent advocate for the True Faith, and he fought against the Arian heresy with his brother Saint Basil. Gregory was persecuted by the Arians, by whom he was falsely accused of improper use of church property, and thereby deprived of his

See and sent to Ancyra. Saint Gregory was restored to his cathedral after the death of Emperor Valens (378) and was joyously received by his flock. His brother Saint Basil the Great died in 379. Only with difficulty did Saint Gregory survive the loss of his brother and guide. He delivered a funeral oration for him, and completed Saint Basil's study of the six days of Creation. That same year Saint Gregory participated in the Council of Antioch against heretics who refused to recognize the perpetual virginity of the Mother of God. Others at the opposite extreme, who worshipped the Mother of God as being God Herself, were also denounced by the Council. In the year 381 Saint Gregory was one of the chief figures of the Second Ecumenical Council, convened at Constantinople against the heresy of Macedonius, who incorrectly taught about the Holy Spirit. At this Council, on the initiative of Saint Gregory, the Nicean Symbol of Faith (the Creed) was completed. In the year 383, Saint Gregory of Nyssa participated in a Council at Constantinople, where he preached a sermon on the divinity of the Son and the Holy Spirit. He was distinguished by his magnanimity, patience and love of peace. Having reached old age, Saint Gregory of Nyssa died soon after the Council of Constantinople.

**HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION THIS PAST WEEK** — Just a reminder that The Feast of Holy Theophany – The Baptism of our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ,



celebrated this past week on January 6 was a HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION. The Canon Law of our Byzantine Catholic Church states: "The Christian faithful are bound by the obligation to participate on **Sundays and feast days (Holy Days of Obligation)** in the Divine Liturgy ...." (Canon 881#1); and "are recommended to receive the

Divine Eucharist on these days ..." (Canon 881 #3); "and should abstain from those labors or business matters which impede the worship to be rendered to God ...." (Canon 881 #4). Neglect of participation renders one guilty of mortal sin, therefore, unworthy to receive the Holy Eucharist, until one makes a worthy sacramental Confession of this voluntarily neglect. This is an important precept of the Church.

If you would like to have your home blessed following the Great Sanctification of Water on the Feast of Holy Theophany, January 6, please call the Church office. House Blessings will conclude prior to the Season of the Great Fast (February 27). By having our homes blessed, we renew our



desire to have God with us throughout the New Year, and to have our most intimate lodging purified by the sanctified water and prayer of the priestly representative!

SEASONAL GREETING UNTIL NEXT SATURDAY — During this festive celebration of Our Lord Jesus' Baptism, the greeting that we salute each other with is CHRIST IS BAPTIZED! (CHRISTOS KRESCAJETSJA!).
