



Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. Is it true that Pope Francis now permits Catholics to divorce and remarry without the guilt of being in mortal sin and the related penalty of prohibition from receiving the Blessed Sacrament? A. Answer by Catholic Answers: Not at all. He cannot teach that as the successor of St. Peter. Rather, what he has been teaching is that there are certain concrete cases that might permit divorced and remarried persons to receive Holy Communion because of some aspect that removes their culpability for their situation. These cases would be so particular that they would have to be described in detail. One cannot generalize about them. He has made it reasonably clear that these cases have to be dealt with one by one. There is no, and there can be no, general permission such as you describe. Many bishops and theologians are not happy with the confusion that has been caused on these points recently, and we should all pray that this confusion is cleared up for the good of the souls who are being misled.

TODAY'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

PREPARING FOR THE GREAT FAST (Matthew 25: 31-46)

The 4th Pregreat Fast Sunday — Evidence of REPENTENCE is EXPRESSED COMPASSION

What do we mean by "Meat-Fare"? — Meat-Fare Sunday indicates a farewell to meat



inasmuch as in the early Christian Church meat was no longer eaten from this time on throughout The Great Fast season (today is comparable to Marti Gras of the Western Church). In the Carpathian Mountains of Eastern Europe the season of The Great Fast the Byzantine Catholic Ruthenian (Rusyn) faithful practiced "strict abstinence" (no meat and dairy products) for the entire Lent including Holy Week. Being an agrarian society with harsh weather conditions, a minimal amount of labor was performed, and a greater concentration was given to the Holy Fast. However, even in our technologically advanced American society, we must make time to

participate in The Great Fast services and maintain at least minimal fasting practices if we have the desire to express our love for the Lord. In this spirit, the Byzantine Catholic Church sets before us today the Last or "Terrible Judgment." Those, whom the Church was unable to convert through its instruction on the mercy of God in the Parable of the Prodigal Son, are now presented with the fear of hell in an attempt to affect them. The liturgical services are designed to fill us with salutary fear and sorrow for our sins. One of the requisites for repentance is the law of love by which Christ at His Judgment will measure all of us. Jesus describes in detail the Terrible Judgment. Compassion and mercy were branded by early philosophers as weakness, but in reality they are the signs of a nobility of heart. Christ has taught us that all those who are filled with love for Him should realize that whatever they do for the poor and the afflicted is done for Him. In describing the Last Judgment, we are led to hope for mercy if we have been charitable to our neighbors. We must always realize that our Lord is merciful in the highest degree, but He is also just.

Ordained to the Presbyterate through the "Imposition of the Hands"



Munhall, PA – On Sunday, January 14, 2018, Archbishop Skurla ordained Deacon Vitalii Stashkevych to the Priesthood at St. John the Baptist Cathedral. Through the sacramental powers of Holy Orders and imposition of the hands of a hierarch an ontological change took place within the ordinand conferring upon him the grace of the Holy Spirit. He has been designated by God to act in the person of Christ enabling him to give rebirth in the Baptism, sealing them with the gift of the Holy Spirit in Chrismation, feed them with Christ's Most Pure Body & Precious Blood, for give sins through the

absolution, making a man and Woman one in one flesh and anointing them with the spiritual strength necessary on their journey to eternity. Fr. Stashkevych is now able to stand at the Holy Altar to offer the Divine Liturgy which is to re-represent the salvific redemption brought about at Mt. Calvary. This joyous occasion was followed by the sad news on the following day that Fr. Vatalii's dad, Nicholas, 58 years of age, who was taken to eternity from a massive heart-attack. May we join our prayers for Fr. Vatalii as he begins his new life as a priest with his wife, Mary Elizabeth; and may we pray for the repose of the soul of Nicholas, his beloved father, that God may remember him forever. Saint of the Week

The Holy Woman-Martyr Agatha — February 5

Agatha, this glorious virgin and martyr for Christ, was born in the Sicilian town of Palermo of noble and wealthy parents. When Emperor Decius began a persecution



against Christians, St. Agatha was arrested and brought to trial before Judge Quintian. The judge, seeing Agatha beautiful in countenance, desired to have her for his wife. When he suggested this, Agatha answered that she is the bride of Christ and cannot be unfaithful to her Betrothed. Quintian subjected her to cruel tortures. Agatha was ridiculed, whipped, bound to a tree and flogged until blood flowed. After that, the judge again tried to persuade her to deny Christ and to avoid any further torture and suffering. To that the bride of Christ replied: "These tortures are very beneficial for me; just as wheat cannot arrive at the granary before it is cleansed from the chaff, so my soul cannot enter into Paradise if my body, beforehand, is not humbled by

tortures." Then, the torturer ordered that her breasts be cut off and that she be cast into prison. St. Peter appeared to Agatha in prison and restored her to health and wholeness of body. Again, Agatha was led out for torture and again, cast into prison where she gave up her soul to God in the year 251 A.D. in the town of Catania during the reign of Emperor Decius. After her death, the torturer Quintian departed for Palermo to usurp her estate. However, along the way, his horse and the horses of his soldiers became wild with rage. Quintian was bitten on the face, thrown to the ground and trampled to death. Swift was the punishment of God that reached out for this savage crime perpetrated against St. Agatha.
