Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. Is it okay for me to receive scholarship money from the Minnesota Masonic Charities? I am not enrolling in the Masons, and I don't agree with their beliefs, but I am in desperate need of money for college. A. Answer from Catholic Answers: That's a good question. We don't want to give scandal, i.e., lead others into sin, by virtue of our actions (see CCC 2284-87). If the local Masonic group plans on publicizing its winners and also noting that you're a Catholic, I would decline, because it would give the impression that there are a certain fellowship and collaboration between the Catholic Church and Masons that do not exist. Instead of giving scandal, better to take out a loan, get a job while going to school and also earn your degree in five or six years than the normal four. If, on the other hand, the local Masons are happy to support a local Catholic kid without using it as an opportunity to give a promotional misimpression about their status in the eyes of the Church. I think receiving the scholarship would be arguably okay.

Are Bad Catholics Still Catholics?

(Continued from the article: Are Bad Catholics Still Catholic") — acts" (CCC 1463).... It is even more clear that someone who still professes to be Catholic—even unfaithfully—remains so, even if it is purely in a "bodily" way and not "in his heart." Although there is no doubt that public figures—as well as private individuals—gravely compromise their communion with the Church when they reject key Catholic teachings and values, this doesn't mean that they literally cease to be Catholics. Bad Catholics are still Catholics. And that just makes their betrayal of the Faith worse.

Today's Gospel Meditation

The 1st of Five Sundays Prior to the Great Fast

The DESIRE to Follow Jesus (Luke 19: 1-10)

Today commences the first of five Sundays in preparation to the Lenten Season



which is still one month away. The theme of "Repentance" is set before us and continues for two forthcoming Sundays. Today lesson is the first Pregreatfast Sunday of Zacchaeus. His name means PURE or JUSTIFIED. HE was the wealthy man of Jerusalem who gathered revenue for the Roman government, but who became a disciple of Christ (Luke 19:1-10). A "chief publican," Zacchaeus might have been of a higher grade than Matthew. Although not one of Christ's expected converts. Zacchaeus had heard much about Christ and **DESIRED** to see Him for himself. When ultimately Christ came his way there were two obstacles in his way-the crowd, and his own short stature. But he guickly overcame both hindrances. Our Lord called Zacchaeus

down and invited Himself to his house. Zacchaeus was a sinner and Christ saved him. Quickly Zacchaeus revealed the depth of his **DESIRE** and surrendered to his newly found Master. There came an immediate and generous restitution. His DESIRE for Jesus teaches us that through Repentance we take our first serious step to surrender ourselves to Him and follow it by good deeds.

Are Bad Catholics Still Catholics?

(The following abridged article (January 30, 2019) by Catholic Apologist: Jimmy Akin is taken from the website: www.catholic.com. Due to a lack of space the highlighted portion)

Last week, on the forty-sixth anniversary of Roe v. Wade, New York governor Andrew Cuomo enthusiastically signed that state's "Reproductive Health Act." Many commentators observed that New York now has the most radical pro-abortion law of any state in the country, and criticism of Cuomo quickly followed. Part of the criticism was based on the fact that Cuomo is a baptized Catholic; many were aghast at the spectacle of a Catholic taking such a radical pro-abortion stance.... Unfortunately, Cuomo is not alone. We live in an age in which many Catholics who are public figures betray key teachings and values of the Faith. Of course, our age is not unique. There have always been bad Catholics-including bad Catholics in high places.... To answer this question, we need to look at the Church's official documents. According to the Second Vatican Council: He is not saved . . who, though part of the body of the Church, does not persevere in charity. He remains indeed in the bosom of the Church, but, as it were, only in a "bodily" manner and not "in his heart" (Lumen Gentium 14). By losing the gift of charity, a bad Catholic ceases to be a member of the Church "in his heart," but he remains in it "bodily.".... By being baptized in the Church—or by being received into it after being baptized elsewhere—one becomes subject to the laws of the Church, and these obligations remain even when one betrays the Faith in fundamental ways..... There are penalties for committing these crimes, including excommunication (can. 1364 §1). However, even excommunication does not mean that one ceases to be a member of the Church. Instead, as the Catechism explains, excommunication is "the most severe ecclesiastical penalty." It "impedes the reception of the sacraments and the exercise of certain ecclesiastical (cont. near the back).

Saint of the Week

The Holy, Righteous Simeon the God-Receiver & Prophetess Anna — February 3

Righteous Simeon the God-Receiver was, according to the testimony of the holy Evangelist Luke, a just and devout man waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him



(Luke 2:25). God promised him that he would not die until the promised Messiah, Christ the Lord, came into the world. Ancient historians tell us that the Egyptian pharaoh Ptolemy II Philadelphus (285-247 B.C.) wished to include texts of Holy Scripture in the famous Library at Alexandria. He invited scholars from Jerusalem, and the Sanhedrin sent their wise men. The Righteous Simeon was one of the seventy scholars who came to Alexandria to translate the Holy Scriptures into Greek. The completed work was called "The Septuagint," and is the version of the Old Testament used by the Catholic and Orthodox Churches. Simeon was translating a book of the Prophet Isaiah, and read the words: "Behold, a virgin shall conceive in the womb, and shall bring forth a Son" (Is 7:14). He

thought that "virgin" was inaccurate, and he wanted to correct the text to read "woman." At that moment an angel appeared to him and held back his hand saying, "You shall see these words fulfilled. You shall not die until you behold Christ the Lord born of a pure and spotless Virgin." From this day, Saint Simeon lived in expectation of the Promised Messiah. One day, the righteous Elder received a revelation from the Holy Spirit, and came to the Temple. It was on the very day (the fortieth after the Birth of Christ) when the All-Pure Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph had come to the Temple in order to perform the ritual prescribed by Jewish Law. When Saint Simeon beheld their arrival, the Holy Spirit revealed to him that the divine Child held by the All-Pure Virgin Mary was the Promised Messiah, the Savior of the world. The Elder took the Child in his arms and said, "Lord, now let Your servant depart in peace, according to Your word, for mine eyes have seen Your salvation, which You have prepared before the face of all people, a light of revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of Your people Israel" (Lk. 2:29-32). Simeon blessed the All-Pure Virgin and Saint Joseph, and turning to the Mother of God he said, "Behold, this child is set for the fall and rising again of many in Israel, and for a sign which shall be spoken against. Yea, a sword shall pierce through your own soul also, that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed" (Lk. 2:34-35). The holy Evangelist continues: "And there was one Anna, a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, and had lived with a husband for seven years from her virginity; and she was a widow of about eighty-four years, who did not leave the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers night and day. And coming at that very hour, also gave thanks to the Lord, and spoke of Him to all those who looked for redemption at Jerusalem" (Luke 2:36-38). The holy righteous Simeon the God-Receiver died at a great age (Tradition says he was 360). His holy relics were transferred to Constantinople in the sixth century.
