Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. Does the Bible teach the sacrament of extreme unction? A. Answer by a Catholic Apologist: Yes. Extreme Unction, which is more commonly known today as the anointing of the sick, has its biblical foundation in James 5:14-16: "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins he will be forgiven." This sacrament, in addition to remitting sin and strengthening the soul (and often the body) through an infusion of sanctifying grace, helps us unite our physical sufferings with those of Jesus. For additional insight you might read Matthew 10:1, Mark 6:13, Romans 8:17, and Colossians 1:24.

Since the Church now has a HAVC biannual Service Agreement with Tudi Mechanical Systems, McKees Rocks, they were contacted to search out the problem. A commercial circulating pump near the boilers had malfunctioned and needed to be replaced. The cost \$1,200.00. All is now back in order. Also worthy of mentioning is the school roof on the Olivia Street side of

the building was leaking water into one of the A.I.U. Classrooms. Triangle Roofing of Pittsburgh was contacted to patch the problem thus far successfully. They had mentioned the roof should really be replaced since it is at least 30 years old.

The 5th & Final Pregreat Fast Sunday — Beginning the Penitential Journey with the right Attitude & Disposition (Matthew 6: 14-21)

What do we mean by "Cheese-fare" and to "Give Up?

Cheese-fare Sunday indicates a farewell to dairy products just as last week's Meat-Fare said farewell to meat products until Resurrection Sunday. As in the early Christian



Church dairy products and meat were no longer eaten throughout The Great Fast Season and throughout Holy Week. Although mandatory Church laws have been abrogated as to its obligatory nature, it still encourages us to do penance on the days prescribed (Pure Monday & Great Friday); and NO MEAT on Wednesdays and Fridays. Most importantly, we are all called to Fast from SIN and GIVE UP negativity by PUTTING ON virtue and being positive. Today, the Church invokes us to remember what participation in sin did — expelling Adam and Eve from Paradise. It will also keep us from entering the heavenly kingdom.

Our Holy Father's General Audience Vatican City State on the 'OUR FATHER'— January 27, 2019

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In our continuing catechesis on the "Our Father", we now turn to

the first of the seven invocations, "hallowed by thy name". Here we see the pattern of all prayer. which is always made, on the one hand, in contemplation of God, and on the other, in a sincere supplication for our needs. When we speak to God, he already knows us better than we know ourselves, for even if God is a mystery to us, we are not an enigma in his eyes. He is like a mother for whom a simple glance enables her immediately to perceive the condition of her

children. A first step in prayer, then, is to entrust ourselves to God and his providence. This leads us to pray: "Hallowed be thy name", where we not only express our trust in God's greatness, but also ask that his name be sanctified in us, in our families, our communities and the whole world. We can do this because it is God who sanctifies and transforms us by his love. Prayer casts out every fear, since the Father loves us, the Son lifts up his arms to support ours, and the Spirit works in a hidden way for the redemption of the world.

ST. BASIL THE GREAT ON FASTING: There is both a physical and a spiritual fast. In the physical fast the body abstains from food and drink. In the spiritual fast, the faster abstains from evil intentions, words and deeds. One who truly fasts abstains from anger, rage, malice, and vengeance. One who truly fasts abstains from idle and foul talk, empty rhetoric, slander, condemnation, flattery, lying and all manner of spiteful talk. In a word, a real faster is one who withdraws from all evil. As much as you subtract from the body, so much will you add to the strength of the soul. By fasting it is possible both to be delivered from future evils and to enjoy the good things to come.

Saint of the Week The Holy Martyr Conon of Isauria

March 5

The Holy Martyr Conon of Isauria was born in Bethany, a village near the Asia Minor city of Isauria, whose inhabitants had accepted Christianity from the Apostle Paul.



From his youth, Saint Conon was accorded the special protection of the "Archistrategos" ("Leader of the Heavenly Hosts") Michael, who appeared to him and assisted him in many difficult circumstances in life. At the insistence of his parents. Conon was betrothed to a maiden named Anna. He persuaded her to live with him in virginity after the wedding. The young couple lived as brother and sister, devoting themselves entirely to God. Saint Conon brought also his parents to the Christian Faith. His father, Saint Nestor, received a martyr's death for denouncing idolworshippers. After burying both his mother and wife. Saint Conon continued his service to God, devoting himself entirely to monastic works, fasting and prayer. In his declining years the holy ascetic was glorified with the gift of wonderworking. By virtue of his

preaching and miracles many pagans were converted to Christ. It is said that even the evil spirits were forced to serve him. When a persecution against Christians broke out in Isauria, one of the first to suffer was Saint Conon. He was subjected to fierce torments for his refusal to offer sacrifice to idols. When the people of Isauria learned of the tortures to which the saint was being subjected, they came forth bearing arms to defend the martyr. Frightened by the people's wrath, the torturers fled, and the Isaurians found the martyr wounded and bloodied at the place of torture. Saint Conon wished to endure martyrdom for the Lord, but he lived two more years. Saint Conon died in the second century and was buried beside his parents and wife.

STRICT ABSTINENCE (No Meat or Dairy Products) is to be observed on the first day of The Great Fast — PURE MONDAY, March 4 and on Holy & Great Friday, April 19. If you are unable to keep either abstinence for a just cause, you are to **seek a dispensation** from the pastor.

FORGIVENESS VESPERS TODAY — This Afternoon, March 3, 2019 @ 2:00 p.m. in McKees Rocks, we will gather to bring in the Penitential Season of The Great Fast. Anointing with blessed oil will be administered (this is not the sacrament of Anointing) rather it's a sacramental to strengthen us on the Lenten Journey. Oil is a symbol of strength. Please set aside this time and join us as we embark in this season of penance.





CALCULATING 40 DAYS OF LENT IN THE BYZANTINE RITE — From Pure



Monday, March 4 to Palm Friday, April 12 constitute the 40 days of the Great Fast. Holy Week is not part of the Great Fast Season. The 40 days prepare us to cleanse our souls and bodies from sin so that from Lazarus Saturday (April 13) we are made worthy to walk vicariously with Our Lord in the remaining 8 days (especially through the special liturgical church services) we may comfort our Lord through His salutary Passion, Death,

Entombment and Radiant Resurrection. Let us all individually and collectively take a more serious approach in this part of our relationship to our Awesome Triune God.
