Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. Is there a theological reason why a priest should celebrate Saturday morning Mass (Divine Liturgy) when he holds daily Mass (Divine Liturgy) Monday through Friday? A. Catholic Answers Apologist: A theological argument for celebrating Mass (Divine Liturgy) every day may be made in that doing so consecrates the fullness of the week to God... A quite significant reason to celebrate Mass (Divine Liturgy) on Saturday is for the pastoral good of those in the parish so that they can consecrate the day in this way (or the week, if they are in the habit of daily Communion). It is recommended that priests celebrate the Eucharist daily, but it is not required. [Personal insert: although the Eastern Rite Code of Canon Law does not explicitly state this directive, it does, however, adhere to what is outwardly stated in the (Roman Rite) Code of Canon Law unless the local hierarch directs otherwisel: Remembering that the work of redemption is continually accomplished in the mystery of the Eucharistic sacrifice, priests are to celebrate frequently; indeed daily celebration is strongly recommended, since even if the faithful cannot be present, it is the act of Christ and the Church in which priests fulfill their principal function. SUBJECT MATTER DISCUSSED AT PAC/FAC MEETING — At last Monday's Parish & Financial Advisory Council Meeting, August 26, 2019, discussion on the highlighted topics were reviewed: (1)

Preparing for the sale of the Holy Ghost Social Center and properties adjacent to it totaling app. 3 acres We are still awaiting the acknowledgement of the Archieparchial Lawyer to review the Berkshire Hathaway & Howard Hanna write up (2) The installation of a backflow valve was installed in the church due to a regulation from the Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority. This is now a requirement for all commercial buildings which include churches. The total cost as was



reported in a previous S.O.T. Church Bulletin was \$995.00. We had received a few donations totaling \$250.00. The Church is responsible for the remaining amount; (3) The Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority contacted Holy Ghost Church to replace the rectory water meter. Upon installing the meter, they noticed that a lead piping elbow was in poor condition and needed replaced. They also indicated that if the entire pipe leading to the street is made of lead it would have to be replaced. It is still unclear at whose expense this will be, either the City or HGC. We are looking into the matter.

SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Jesus offers the same challenge today As He offered the Rich Man in today's Gospel

(Matthew 19: 16-26)

The great truth of this story lies in the way it illumines the meaning of eternal life. Eternal life is life such as God himself lives. The word for eternal is aionios, which does not



mean lasting or ever; it means such as befits God, or such as belongs to God, or such as is characteristic of God. The great characteristic of God is that He so loved and He gave. Therefore, the essence of eternal life is not a carefully calculated keeping of the commandments and the rules and the regulations; eternal life is based on an attitude of loving and sacrificial generosity to our fellow-men. If we would find eternal life, if we would find happiness, joy, satisfaction, peace of mind and serenity of heart, it shall not be by piling up a credit balance with God through keeping commandments and observing rules and regulations; it shall

be through reproducing God's attitude of love and care to our fellow-men. To follow Christ and in grace and generosity to serve the men for whom Christ died are one and the same thing. In the end the young man turned away in great distress. He refused the challenge, because he had great possessions. His tragedy was that he loved things more than he loved people; and he loved himself more than he loved others. Any man who puts things before people and self before others, must turn his back on Jesus Christ.

The Holy Father, Pope Francis Teaches

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In our catechesis on the Acts of the Apostles, we reflect on how the Lord strengthens the early Christian community, enabling it to grow and to serve those most in



need. The vitality of the emerging Church, even when threatened by attacks, can be seen in the ministry of Saint Peter. Like Jesus, he is drawn to the suffering, especially the sick and infirm, and – filled with the Spirit of the Lord – he carries out Christ's own work of healing. Yet such activity induces the hatred of the Sadducees, who imprison the Apostles and seek to put a stop to their teaching. Peter's response, however, that "we must obey God rather than

men" (Acts 5:29), provides us with a key to our Christian life. This means listening to God without delay or reservation, and remaining faithful to him. As we strive to be of service to our brothers and sisters, let us ask the Holy Spirit for the interior strength of knowing that the Lord is always at our side.

ECCLESIASTICAL NEW YEAR TODAY — Our Church marks the commencement of a brand New Year **today**, **Sept. 1**. It is referred to as THE YEAR OF INDICTION. In the Byzantine Empire 312 AD., the civil year began on Sept. 1. An "indiction" was a reoccurring cycle of 15 years and used for determining periods of time. *It is believed that Jesus began his public Ministry on this day*. Thus, the Byzantine Catholic Church continues to commemorate a new liturgical year at this time! *Let us make a resolution to attend ALL SUNDAYS & HOLY DAYS in this NEW (CHURCH) YEAR!*



Saint of the Week — September 3 The Bishop-Martyr Anthimus of Nicomedia

The Bishop-Martyr Anthimus of Nicomedia, and those with him suffered during the persecution against Christians under the emperors Diocletian (284-305) and Maximian (305-311). The



persecution became particularly intense after a fire at the imperial court at Nicomedia. The pagans accused the Christians of setting the fire and reacted against them with terrible ferocity. In Nicomedia alone, on the day of the Nativity of Christ, as many as twenty thousand Christians were burned inside a church. However, this monstrous inhumanity did not frighten the Christians, who firmly confessed their faith and endured martyrdom for Christ. Saints Dorotheus, Mardonius, Migdonius, Peter, Indes and Gorgonius died during this period. One of them was beheaded by the sword, others perished by burning, or being buried alive, or by drowning in the sea. The soldier Zeno boldly denounced the emperor Maximian, for which he was stoned, and then beheaded. Then the holy Virgin Martyr Domna, a former pagan priestess, perished at the

hands of the pagans, and also St Euthymius, because of their concern that the bodies of the holy martyrs should be buried. Bishop Anthimus, who headed the Church of Nicomedia, hid himself in a village not far from Nicomedia at the request of his flock. From there he sent letters to the Christians, urging them to cleave firmly to the holy Faith and not to fear tortures. One of his letters, sent with Deacon Theophilus, was intercepted and given to the emperor Maximian. Theophilus was interrogated and died under torture, without revealing to his torturers the whereabouts of Bishop Anthimus. After a while Maximian managed to learn where St Anthimus was, and sent a detachment of soldiers after him. The bishop met them along the way, but the soldiers did not recognize the saint. He invited them to join him and provided a meal, after which he revealed that he was the one they sought. The soldiers did not know what to do. They wanted to leave him and tell the emperor that they had not found him. Bishop Anthimus was not one to tolerate a lie, and so he would not consent to this. The soldiers came to believe in Christ and received holy Baptism. The saint ordered them to carry out the emperor's instructions. When Bishop Anthimus was brought before the emperor, the emperor ordered that the instruments of execution be brought out and placed before him. "Do you think, emperor, to frighten me with these tools of execution?" asked the saint. "No indeed, you cannot frighten one who wishes to die for Christ! Execution is frightening only for the cowardly, for whom the present life is most precious." The emperor then directed that the saint be fiercely tortured and beheaded by the sword. Bishop Anthimus joyfully glorified God with his last breath, and received the crown of martyrdom.

A Short History of Labor Day

The first Labor Day was celebrated on **September 5, 1882**, in New York City, when 10,000 workers marched from city hall to Union Square. Those who participated took a day off

without pay and voiced their demands. In 1884, the first Monday in September was selected as the official holiday, and the Central Labor Union, who organized the first Labor Day, encouraged organizations in other cities to celebrate the workingman's holiday on that specific date. The concept spread throughout the country and was celebrated in most major industrial cities. The first state law recognizing Labor Day was passed by Oregon in 1887. That same year, four more states, Colorado, Massachusetts, New



Jersey and New York, recognized Labor Day. **By 1894**, a total of 28 states have adopted the holiday, and in June Congress passed a federal act, making the first Monday in September a legal holiday. *President Grover Cleveland signed the bill* right after sending troops to quell a strike against the Pullman railroad company. Have a Happy and Safe Labor Day! *Come and let us sanctify the day by participating in the Divine Liturgy at (MR) 9:00 a.m.*
