

Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. Is pornography wrong? A. Answer by a Catholic Apologist: Yes. It is sinful for a number of reasons (CCC 2354). The first reason is because it fosters impure thoughts, which are sins against the six and ninth commandments (Ex. 20: 14, 17). Secondly, it easily leads to impure actions such as masturbation, fornication, and adultery. Third, it can bring about a desire for unnatural sex acts because pornography presents a warped view of human sexuality (2 Peter 2:9-17; CCC 2352-53, 2380). Pornography deadens the senses. It reduces the opposite sex to a mere object of pleasure. It also stifles one's ability to communicate, which will be very harmful to a future dating relationship and to marriage.

Our Holy Father's Message of Christmas Vatican City State — December 18, 2019

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In these last days of Advent (Philippian Fast), we do well to ask ourselves: How am I preparing for the birth of Jesus? One way to prepare for Christmas is to set



up a nativity scene in our homes, churches and public spaces, a lovely tradition that began with Saint Francis of Assisi. The Christmas crèche is a kind of living Gospel, a touching reminder that the Lord showed his love for us by being born as one of us, in order to share in our daily lives, hopes and concerns. The name Bethlehem, which means "house of bread", and the image of the manger, evoke the meals which we share as families, and the centrality of Jesus, the living bread

come down from heaven, in our family life. In this world of frenetic activity, the Christmas crèche also encourages us to pause and contemplate what is truly important in life. Everything in the nativity scene speaks of the harmony and peace that only Christ the Savior can bring to our lives and to our world. As we gaze upon the lowly scene of Jesus' birth, let us invite him into our hearts, so that each new day can bring spiritual rebirth and preserve in us the joy of Christmas.

Explanation of this Week's Liturgical Services of Preparation

The Sunday of the Old Testament Holy Fathers

TODAY'S GOSPEL Matthew 1:1-25

The Sunday of the Holy Old Testament Fathers is the Sunday before the



Nativity. They comprise all the righteous ancestors of Christ related to the Christ-Child, according to the flesh, from Abraham to Joseph, the spouse of the Holy Virgin Mary who forms the ancestral family tree of Jesus. They waited patiently with faith in the hope that God would soon sent to them the promised Messiah. They truly anticipated the Savior's coming. At today's Divine Liturgy the genealogy is proclaimed from Matthew's Gospel. In these few remaining

days remaining in the Philippian Fast Let us continue to keep company with Mary and Joseph on the journey to Bethlehem with the joy that is so to come with the birth of our Lord, God & Savior Jesus Christ. Let us not refrain from our prayer, abstinence, almsgiving of mercy, confession of sins, and attendance at Divine Liturgies so that with God's grace we may witness to this good news to those around us.

The Royal Hours & Great Vesperal D.L.

This early morning liturgical service at 8:00 a.m. Christmas Eve referred to as the ROYAL HOURS (celebrating the glorification of Christ's Kingship) reminds us of the fulfilling prophecies of the Old Testament regarding the coming of God's promised Messiah. These promises are fulfilled in Jesus Christ, true God — true Man. This morning prayer of praise honors the Holy Nativity. We glorify God for keeping His Promise and for filling us with joy! At 1:00 p.m we once again gather to celebrate Our Savior's Nativity in the flesh with the official evening prayer of the Church known as GREAT VESPERS W/DIVINE LITURGY OF ST. BASIL THE GREAT. Come, let us adore Him by joining in this day of prayer!

The Traditional Holy Supper

Later this afternoon, we are getting to ready to prepare and eat the Holy Supper

(Sviata Veceria). This has been a cherished custom of our Ruthenian (Rusyn) Byzantine Catholic people for several years. On this Holy Evening (Svjatyj Vecer) the family begins by singing the Troparion and Kontakion of the Holy Nativity. Prior to the main course, it is customary to distribute to each a small piece of prosphora (communion bread) on which honey has been spread together with small piece of garlic. This is



an annual reminder that with Jesus, the Messiah, the Bread of Life, we are sustained in the sweetness and bitterness that face us in life. This was always a day of strict abstinence meal (no meat or dairy). Although it is no longer mandatory, we should at least observe simple abstinence (no meat) concluding with this holy meal. After we partake of the True Bread of Life, Jesus the Messiah, at the Divine Liturgy in Holy Communion, can we then celebrate fully with the goodness of all foods.
