

CHRISTMAS DECORATION TO BE DISMANTLED TODAY — We no sooner set the Church up for Christmas and it's time to dismantle it for another year. **Today**, following the Divine Liturgy, we are asking all volunteers to help put away the festive decorations. The more assistance we can get, the faster we can all depart. Please consider offering an hour of your time, especially if you weren't able to help in the set up.

NEW HEATING AND COOLING UNITS FOR THE GYM - As previously stated, we have rotted steam pipes under the gym floor leaking hundred gallons of water thus disenabling water to fill the boiler retaining tanks for heat. Instead of having the floor dug and new pipes replaced which would be astromically costly, the Pastor and Parish Advisory and Financial Advisory Council have determined that the following optional plan be initiated. We will not only have heat but also air conditioning. Gravener Heating and Cooling of Pittsburgh, who also services our Seminary and Chancery, gave us the following proposal. Permission for this expenditure was granted by the Chancery. The initial work has already begun this past week. Installation of (2) ICP/Carrier rooftop units in gym area. This bid covers the installation of 2- ten-ton rooftop combination gas/electric units These units will be installed on factory curbs flashed in by a certified rubber roofing contractor. We will crane the units up onto the roof area above the gym. A new insulated supply trunk line will be installed below the bar joists with ten-inch supply diffuser rings cut into the bottom of the trunk line. This will direct the warm air down to the floor area to minimize the differential of temperature between the floor and ceiling area. A central style return air grille will be installed at roof level to pull the heat off the ceiling, making the system as efficient as possible for both winter and summer operation. Two 220 volt / 3 phase electric circuits will be installed between the basement breaker box to a disconnect box mounted to the new rooftop unit through the factory curb. A new gas line will be installed from the kitchen area up to both rooftop units. A two-stage thermostat will be installed in the gym space for temperature control. Discounted Installed Grand Total: \$42,000.00. This includes all equipment, ductwork, controls and labor needed to perform a complete installation.

Today's Gospel Reflection

The Blind Man Refused to Be Silent – GOSPEL Luke 18: 35-43: 12-17

It was amongst the wayside crowd that the blind man was sitting. When he heard the murmur of the approaching throng he asked what was happening and was



told that Jesus was passing by. Immediately he cried out to Jesus for help and healing. Thereupon everyone tried to silence him. But the man would not be silenced. He shouted again. So Jesus stopped, and the blind man found the healing he so passionately desired. This story tells us two things. (1) It tells us something about the blind man. He was determined to come face to face with Jesus. Nothing would stop him. He refused to be silent and he refused to be restrained. His sense of need drove him relentlessly into the presence of Jesus. If

a man wants a miracle that is the spirit he must show. A gentle, sentimental longing never really taps the power of God; but the passionate, intense desire of the very depths of the human heart will never be disappointed. (2) It tells us something about Jesus. At that moment he was discoursing to the crowd like any rabbi. But at the blind man's cry of need he stopped; the discourse forgotten. For Jesus it was always more important to act than to talk. Words always took second place to deeds. Here was a human soul in need. Speech must end and action begin. Someone has said that many teachers are like men throwing chatty remarks to a man drowning in a tempestuous sea. Jesus was never like that; he leaped to the rescue of the man. There is many a man who could not put two sentences together but others love him because he is kind. Men may respect an orator but they love a man with helping hands. Men admire a man with a great mind but they love a man with a big heart.

Our Holy Father's General Audience Vatican City State on the Acts of the Apostles— January 15, 2020

Dear Brothers and Sisters: Today we conclude our catechesis on the Acts of the Apostles

with Paul's arrival in Rome, in chains, to appeal his case to Caesar. As we have seen, Saint Luke's account of the spread of the Gospel largely coincides with Paul's missionary journeys. In Rome, Paul is welcomed by the Christian community and permitted to remain under house arrest. Luke ends the Book of Acts not with Paul's martyrdom but by describing his tireless proclamation of the Gospel, showing the power of God's word which can never be chained (cf. 2 Tim 2:9). Paul's missionary journeys, culminating in this City, reveal the power of God's



grace to open hearts to the Gospel and its saving message. Having in these past months followed the spread of the Good News throughout the world, let us ask the Holy Spirit to renew in each one of us the call to be courageous and joyful missionary disciples of Christ. In this way, we – in the footsteps of Paul – will fill our world with the Gospel and make our communities places of fraternity where all can encounter the risen Lord.

Saint of the Week — January 22 Holy Apostle Timothy

Timothy was one of the Seventy Apostles. He was born in Lystra in Lycaonia of a Greek father and a Jewish mother. The Apostle Paul praised



his mother and grandmother because of their sincere faith. " I yearn to see you again, recalling your tears, so that I may be filled with joy, as I recall your sincere faith that first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and that. I am confident, lives also in you" (II Timothy 1: 4-5). Timothy first met with the great apostle in Lystra and was himself a witness when Paul healed the one lame from birth. Later, Timothy was an almost constant traveling companion of Paul, traveling with him to Achaia, Macedonia, Italy and Spain. Sweet in soul, he was a great zealot for the Faith, and a superb preacher. Timothy contributed much to the spreading and establishing of the Christian Faith. Paul calls him "my own son in the faith." "Paul an apostle of Christ

Jesus, Who is our hope, to Timothy, my own son in the Faith: grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord" (I Timothy 1: 1-2). After Paul's martyrdom, Timothy had St. John the Evangelist as his teacher. But when the Emperor Domentian banished John from Ephesus to the island of Patmos, Timothy remained in Ephesus to serve as bishop. During the time of an idolatrous feast called Katagogium, the pagans, resentful of the Christians, treacherously and in disguise, attacked Timothy and killed him about the year 93 A.D. Later his honorable relics were translated to Constantinople and interred in the Church of the Twelve Apostles alongside of the grave of St. Luke the Evangelist and St. Andrew the First-called.
