

Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems Q. Is feminism compatible with the Catholic Faith? A. Answer by a Catholic Apologist: It depends on what you mean by feminism. If you mean women should have the same basic human rights as men, then certainly Catholic teaching agrees (Genesis 1:27; CCC355). However, if by feminism you mean that there should be no social distinctions

between men and women or that women must be ordained to the priesthood, then the answer is "no." This view is typically called "secular" or radical feminism." They hold views that are actually contrary to true feminine dignity. For example, a woman's ability to conceive and bear children is a wonderful gift from God. Yet, many radical feminists view childbearing as a burden or in convenience. They often support abortion, contraception, and homosexuality, things that actually degrade women.


TODAY'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

PREPARING FOR THE GREAT FAST

The 2nd Pregreat Fast Sunday — HUMILITY before God & Neighbor (Luke 18: 10-14)

Jesus was constantly combating the self-righteousness that he found such a sinister

enemy of spiritual progress. This parable is addressed directly to the self-righteous. The Pharisee and the tax collector are stereotypes of the good and the sinful person. The Pharisee prays with straightforward gratitude for his healthy spiritual state. There is no sign that he is trying to deceive. Pharisees did fast severely twice a week, on Mondays and Thursdays, for the good of the whole nation. And there is no reason to doubt that he tithed. The tragedy is that he does not understand the flawed nature of this prayer. He is deceiving himself. He does not look upon himself as God's servant but as one who deserves good of God for a job well done. Besides this pride, he is quilty of contempt for the tax collector. The tax collector is conscious of his sinfulness. He knows that he does not deserve



consideration because of anything he has done. The prayer he utters is one of the sources of the ancient Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." It is this helplessness and dependence that opens one to God's grace; it is the spirit of the child. Earlier Jesus commended one who would say, after doing good work that was a duty, "We are unprofitable servants" (17:10). The debate over faith and works is already engaged here (see Rom 3:27-4:5). Jesus Himself draws the shocking conclusion from the parable: the observant Pharisee goes home unjustified; the sinful tax collector is justified. The reversal maxim concludes the story.

Our Holy Father's General Audience Vatican City State on the Beatitudes — January 29, 2020

Dear Brothers and Sisters: Today we begin a new series of catechesis on the Beatitudes in Matthew's Gospel. Jesus' teaching provides a kind of "identity card" for Christians. Like Moses



on Sinai, Jesus gives these "new commandments" from a hillside. He does not impose them but instead proposes them as the path to true happiness in the future that God promises to his faithful people. Each Beatitude is composed of three parts: the opening word "Blessed", followed by the situation in which those who are called blessed find themselves – poor in spirit, mourning, thirsting for justice – and finally the reason for which they are blessed. The Beatitudes

teach that we are blessed not by our present situation, but rather by the new condition that is ours by God's grace. This first sermon of Jesus thus presents eight "doors" through which we can encounter the power of God's love to transform our lives and history. The Beatitudes point us beyond our limitations, tears and failures towards that Paschal joy born of Christ's own victorious passage from death to life.

SOLEMN HOLY DAY TODAY

The Encounter of the Lord — February 2

The fortieth day after His birth, the All-Holy Virgin brought her Divine Son into the



Temple of Jerusalem, in accordance with the Law, to dedicate Him to God and to purify herself. "Consecrate to me every first-born that opens the womb among the Israelites both of man and beast, for it belongs to me" (Exodus 13:2 & Leviticus 12:2-7). Even though neither the one nor the other was necessary, nevertheless the Lawgiver did not, in anyway, want to transgress His own Law whom He had given through Moses, His servant and prophet. At that time, the high-priest Zachariah, the father of John the Forerunner, was on duty in the Temple ["serving as a priest before God in the order of his division" St. Luke 1:8]. Zachariah placed the Virgin, not in the temple area reserved for women but rather in the area reserved for virgins. On this occasion, two unusual persons

appeared in the Temple: the Righteous Simeon and the Prophetess Anna, the daughter of Phanuel. The righteous Simeon took the Messiah in his arms and said: "Now, Master, You may let Your servant go in peace, according to Your word, for my eyes have seen Your salvation" (St. Luke 2: 29-30). Simeon also spoke the following words about the Christ-child: "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel" (St. Luke 2:34). Then Anna, who from her youth served God in the Temple by fasting and prayer recognized the Messiah and glorified God and proclaimed to the inhabitants of Jerusalem about the coming of the long-awaited One. The Pharisees present in the Temple, who having seen and heard all, became angry with Zachariah because he placed the Virgin Mary in the area reserved for virgins and reported this to King Herod. Convinced that this is the new king about whom the Magi from the east spoke, Herod immediately sent his soldiers to kill Jesus. In the meantime, the Holy Family had already left the city and set out for Egypt under the guidance of an angel of God. The Feast of the Encounter of our Lord in the Temple was celebrated from earliest times but the solemn celebration of this day was established in the year 544 A.D. during the reign of Emperor Justinian.

Feast of THE ENCOUNTER OF THE LORD. The Righteous Simeon was promised by God that he would not pass onto eternity until he had first seen the Messiah in the flesh. It is a day that Byzantine Catholics acknowledge Jesus coming to ENCOUNTER His people. Christ is "the revelation light to the Gentiles and the glory of His people Israel." Jesus comes as the LIGHT OF THE WORLD. It is on this day of the Great Sanctification that candles are solemnly blessed prior to the Divine Liturgy, and distributed to the people to hold as we worship Our Lord. Although the Church provides candles, you may

also wish to bring your own for the solemn blessing.
