

Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

**Q.** In a relationship, how far is "too far" before it is considered a sin? **A. Answer by Catholic Answers:** We are made in the image and likeness of God, which means we cannot treat another person as an object of pleasure (Gn 1:26). Therefore, actions that directly stimulate sexual passion are morally unacceptable (1 Tim 5:22). Our sexual gifts have a much higher and special purpose. Looser sexual behavior becomes a tyrant that keeps making more demands on those involved. Eventually, you and your date will get bored with just kissing and will most likely want to move on to other things. This is called the "law of diminishing returns." Kissing does not always give the same excitement as when you first did it. The more one feeds these passions, the more one's will becomes weakened.... Even when a man and a woman are engaged to be married, they must live chastely. The covenant and consecrated relationship begins only when enter the Holy Mystery (Sacrament) of Marriage WITH THE BLESSING OF God and the Church. The couple must reserve for marriage any expression of affection that belongs to the married life.

# **2<sup>nd</sup> SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST**

### Come, follow me! (Matthew 4:18-23)

The second Sunday after Pentecost shows us the practical application of the great call to renunciation formulated by Jesus in the gospel for the first Sunday. The



gospel read today at the Divine Liturgy tells of the calling of the first apostles. On the shore of Lake Galilee, Jesus sees Simon and Andrew fishing. He says to them: 'Follow me'. He wants to make them fishers of men. 'And they straightway left their nets, and followed him'. Further on Jesus meets James and John, also fishermen, in the company of their father, Zebedee. Jesus calls them. 'They immediately left the ship and their father, and followed him.' The new

disciples abandoned their nets and their ships: Jesus sometimes asks us to renounce our profession, our instruments of work, whatever we possess. But some sons, at the call of Jesus, abandon their father too: sometimes he wants us to abandon family affections, human friendships, created love. This is not a purely negative attitude. Jesus' call has a very positive aspect: one must follow the Master. But the first apostles could not have followed the Master if they had not first of all left their ships, and their nets, and their father. And what have I abandoned in order to follow Jesus? What does he want me to leave?

On the Third Friday following Holy Pentecost, the Byzantine-

Ruthenian Catholic Church has always commemorated the *Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (Prazdnik Najsvjatijsaho Serdca Isusa).* On this day, the Church renders a special tribute to our Lord Jesus Christ as THE *LOVER OF MANKIND.* A person's heart is a symbol of love. Just as God loves us, we are to ask to beseech His grace to increase our love for God and neighbor. ### Saints of the Week St. Tychon the Wonder-Worker, Bishop of Amathus — June 16

Saint Tikhon, Bishop of Amathus, was born in the city Amathus on the island of Cyprus. His parents raised their son in Christian piety, and taught him the reading of sacred books. It is



said that the gift of wonder-working appeared in St Tikhon at guite a young age. His father was the owner of a bakery, and whenever he left his son alone in the shop, the holy youth would give free bread to those in need. Learning of this, his father became angry, but the son said that he had read in the Scriptures, that in giving to God one receives back a hundredfold. "I," said the youth, "gave to God the bread which was taken," and he persuaded his father to go to the place where the grain was stored. With astonishment the father saw that the granary, which formerly was empty, was now filled to overflowing with wheat. From that time the father did not hinder his son from distributing bread to the poor. A certain gardener brought the dried prunings of vines from the vineyard. St Tikhon gathered them, planted them in his garden and besought the Lord that these branches might take root and yield fruit for the health of people. The Lord did so through the faith of the holy youth. The branches

took root, and their fruit had a particular and very pleasant taste. It was used during the lifetime of the saint and after his death for making wine for the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist. They accepted the pious youth into the church clergy, by ordaining him a Reader. Later, Mnemonios, the Bishop of Amathus ordained him a deacon. After the death of Bishop Mnemonios, St Tikhon by universal agreement was chosen as Bishop of Amathus. St Epiphanius, Bishop of Cyprus (May 12), presided at the service. St Tikhon labored zealously to eradicate the remnants of paganism on Cyprus; he destroyed a pagan temple and spread the Christian Faith. The holy bishop was generous, his doors were open to all, and he listened to and lovingly fulfilled the request of each person who came to him. Fearing neither threats nor tortures, he firmly and fearlessly confessed his faith before pagans. In the service to St Tikhon it is stated that he foresaw the time of his death, which occurred in the year 425.

A traditional and optional remembrance of the Most Holy Virgin's role focusing on her



presence at the foot of the Cross is celebrated on the Third Saturday after Holy Pentecost. Her title as the *COMPASSIONATE MOTHER* focuses on the suffering she enduring at the crucifixion scene. It was a true and abiding love that moved Mary to willing share in her Divine Son's sufferings which He endured for all mankind. We are called to imitate her love as we see Jesus in the person of our neighbor and be with them in their sufferings.

**ANNUAL PETER'S PENCE COLLECTION** — The History of the Peter's Pence Collection derives its name from an ancient custom. In ninth-century England. King Alfred the Great

collected money, a "pence," from landowners as financial support for the Pope. Today, the Peter's Pence Collection supports the Pope's philanthropy by giving the Holy Father the means to provide emergency assistance to those in need because of natural disaster, war, oppression, and disease. In his address of March 20, 2013, Pope Francis spoke of our responsibility before the world and creation. "There is much that we can do to benefit the poor, the needy and those who suffer, and to favor justice, promote reconciliation and build



peace," he said. The Peter's Pence Collection unites us in solidarity to the Holy See and its works of charity to those in need. Your generosity allows the Pope to respond to our suffering brothers and sisters. **N.B.** In a recent article, the Holy Father has moved the Peter's Pence Collection to October due to the Covid-19 pandemic.
