Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. Does the Church believe in life on other planets? **A.** Answer by Catholic Answers: The Church does not officially teach on the matter. There is no biblical evidence for or against life on other planets. However, if there is life "out there," our God is the God of whatever life exists, for there is only one God (Is. 45:5; CCC 290, 300, 2085). Because God has given us no revelation on this matter in the Bible or Sacred Tradition, many speculative questions can be raised regarding life on other planets. Here are a few: (1) What type of beings are they? (2) Did they fall through sin, or are they still in a pristine, unfallen state? (3) Has God revealed Himself to them?; Do they have a Bible? (4) What kind of soul would extraterrestrial beings have? There are many other questions we may ask, but remember: It is entirely possible that human beings are the only intelligent beings in the universe. God could have created things this way. Focus on this: The Catholic Faith is true, and regardless of what lies "out there," we need to pursue holiness and truth "down here."

8th SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Christ's Compassion: Feeding the Multitude (Matthew 14: 14-22)

The great New Testament miracle of the multiplication of the loaves reminds us of another miracle, the one performed by God's Prophet Elijah. Elijah had told King Ahab and his wife Jezebel that God would punish the apostasy of Israel and its ruler for worshiping the heathen sun-god Baal. This punishment would be in the form of a long drought and famine. During the drought, Elijah went to Zerephath, where he was hospitably received by a poor widow and her son, who offered

him their last meal. He rewarded their charity by miraculously increasing their flour and oil - just enough each day to feed them - throughout the three-and-a-half years the famine lasted.

In the churches of our metropolitan province, we are reminded of this great miracle every time that there is festive anointing - 'mirovanije' - on the occasion of special holydays. During the Vesper Service preceding the feast day, the priest blesses five loaves of bread, and the prayer of blessing mentions the miracle of the feeding of over 5,000 people.

Sacramental Bread — Why did Our Lord Jesus perform this great miracle of feeding over 5,000 people? He wanted to prepare them for still another miracle, an even greater one, the one that He performed at the Last Supper, when He changed the substance of bread into His own Body. This He did when He blessed the bread, saying: "Take and eat: this is My Body," and changed the wine into His Precious Blood. He thus instituted the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, through which we today receive the spiritual nourishment necessary for our souls. Jesus Himself said: I am the Bread of Life. He who comes to Me shall never hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst." In order to unite us with Him spiritually, Our Lord enables us to receive Him every time the Divine Liturgy is celebrated, for the nourishment and salvation of our souls. May we always approach Him worthily and thank Him, collectively and personally, for this Most Precious Gift!

"The Eucharist is the heart and the summit of the Church's life, for in it Christ

Saint of the Week — July 27 The Holy Great-Martyr Panteleimon the Healer

The Great Martyr and Healer Panteleimon was born in the city of Nicomedia into the family of the illustrious pagan Eustorgius, and he was named Pantoleon. His mother



Saint Euboula (March 30) was a Christian. She wanted to raise her son in the Christian Faith, but she died when the future martyr was just a young child. His father sent Pantoleon to a pagan school, after which the young man studied medicine at Nicomedia under the renowned physician Euphrosynus. Pantoleon came to the attention of the emperor Maximian (284-305), who wished to appoint him as royal physician when he finished his schooling. The hieromartyrs Hermolaus, Hermippus and Hermocrates, survivors of the massacre of 20,000 Christians in 303 (December 28), were living secretly in Nicomedia at that time. Saint Hermolaus saw Pantoleon time and again when he came to the house where they were hiding. Once, the priest invited the youth to the

house and spoke about the Christian Faith. After this Pantoleon visited Saint Hermolaus every day. One day the saint found a dead child on the street. He had been bitten by a great snake, which was still beside the child's body. Pantoleon began to pray to the Lord Jesus Christ to revive the dead child and to destroy the venomous reptile. He firmly resolved that if his prayer were fulfilled, he would become a follower of Christ and receive Baptism. The child rose up alive, and the snake died before Pantoleon's eyes. After this miracle, *Pantoleon was baptized by Saint Hermolaus with the name Panteleimon (meaning "all-merciful")*. Speaking with Eustorgius, Saint Panteleimon prepared him to accept Christianity. When the father saw how his son healed a blind man by invoking Jesus Christ, he then believed in Christ and was baptized by Saint Hermolaus together with the man whose sight was restored. After the death of his father, Saint Panteleimon dedicated his life to the suffering, the sick, the unfortunate and the needy. He was arrested, tortures and was beheaded. An olive tree to which the saint was tied became covered with fruit. Many who were present at the execution believed in Christ. The saint's body was thrown into a fire, but remained unharmed, and was buried by Christians.

PENITENTIAL PERIOD IN PREPARATION FOR THE DORMITION FEAST — Each year the Byzantine Catholic Church sets aside the first fourteen days of August in honor of the Virgin



Mary. On August 15th, the faithful then gather to celebrate the Great Feast of the Dormition (Falling-Asleep) of the Theotokos. During this fourteen-day penitential period, the Church prescribes the Paraklis Service be held in honor of the Mother of God. The word "paraklis" has two different meanings: the first is "consolation," from which the Holy Spirit is called the "Paraclete," or "Consoler"; the second is "supplication" or "petition". The Paraklis Service consists of

supplication hymns to obtain consolation and courage. It should be recited in times of temptation, discouragement or sickness. It is used more particularly during the two weeks before the Dormition of the Theotokos, from **August 1 to August 14.** The theme of this Paraklis Services centers around the petition. "Most Holy Mother of God, save us." *Following each of the daily Divine Liturgies we will offer a portion of this service for all our family, relatives and friends who have left our church so that they may return for the sake of their salvation.*

GCU NORTHWEST PITTSBURGH LODGE CONTINUES AID TO FISHER HOUSE — Our local GCU Lodge is currently collecting items to help Pittsburgh's VA Fisher House.

The Pittsburgh Fisher House is a 10-bedroom "home away from home" and provides a place for visiting families to stay, free of charge, while their loved ones receive inpatient medical care at VA Pittsburgh Healthcare System. The Pittsburgh Fisher House is professionally furnished and features a common kitchen, laundry facilities, spacious dining room, living room with a library, and toys for children. They



are requesting assistance in keeping these areas stocked with supplies. Boxes are now placed at the side vestibule and narthex areas of both parishes for the *collection that will extend to August 23 (the day of our 3rd quarterly meeting)*. Needed items are listed on the flyer (please take one) near the Churches entrances. Let's help our afflicted veterans and their families by supporting the Lodge in this fraternal collection!

COMBINED LIVING WILL AND HEALTH CARE POWER OF ATTORNEY — Two very important documents are available to you regarding a Catholic approach to Health Care. Many Catholics are

Perhaps, you may have been presented by a health care institution with a form to mark off the care you wish to receive if you could not answer yourself. You may have even marked that you do not want hydration and nutrition to be given due to your illness. Be advised that hydration and nutrition are not necessarily extraordinary means but Ordinary Means in most cases! It is ERRONEOUS to accept the statement that we are not to feed or hydrate human life since it is a process of dying! If we are going to succumb to biological death it must be due to the disease and not from a lack of

hydration and nutrition. This is why Catholic Health Services forms were drawn up and given the blessing of our hierarchy. USE THIS FORM WHEN ASKED! This form was developed by Pennsylvania's Conference of Catholic Bishops to offer ethical and religious guidance. It is the Catholic approach to life issues.
