Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems Q. Does the Catholic Church allow birth control? A. Answer by Catholic Answers: One of the most awesome gifts God gave us is the ability to generate new life made in His image. Human beings (one male & one female) are co-creators with God in this process. Contraception deliberately thwarts this God-given gift by treating conception as an evil to be avoided. The sin of contraception may be committed by use of contraception pills, condoms, spermicides, physical or chemical "barriers," sterilization, and other means. None of these are morally acceptable forms of family planning. On the other hand, there are morally acceptable means of "regulating births." Natural Family Planning (NFP) uses the signs of a woman's natural monthly cycle to determine fertility. God deigned the marital act with two inherent meanings. These meanings are "written into" the act itself. They are the "unitive" or person-uniting meaning (Gn. 2:24) and the "procreative" or person-begetting meaning (Gn. 1:28). These two meanings are interrelated and are intended by God to be present in every act of copulation.

CONTINUAL FLOODING IN CHURCH LIBRARY AREA — Each time that we receive a torrential downpour, our library gets flooded. Much like our school basement, it is mixed with both rain and

sewer water. The problem is also tied into the Convent Building which also gets flooded. This past week this occurrence happened twice this past week and several times over the summer. Matt Mertz Plumbing, Peoples Road, Pittsburgh who solved our school problem rendering satisfactory results were called in to evaluate the problem. Their proposal: (1) Excavate the interior sewer in the Convent to the Church replacing all interior sewer lines with PVC pipe to all floor drains originating through the foundation walls; (2) Haul away spoils, backfill with gravel and patch cement; and (3) to hydro jet lateral lines



providing repair options as needed. This will be a several days project. The total cost: \$18, 500.00. Upon presentation to our Parish & Financial Advisory Councils, and the permission to incur this expenditure from the Chancery office, we will commence the project.

WE ARE AWAITING THE REPAIR & CLEANING OF MOTHER MARY — We received a proposal from the Alex Restoration & Masonry Repairs, New Castle, PA. They will complete the following



on & Masonry Repairs, New Castle, PA. They will complete the following work: (1) Repoint small open mortar joints on the base of the statue; (2) Clean the Statue; and (3) seal the statue. The total cost including a 10% discount is \$2,025.00. Thus far, we have received \$1,000.00 in donations. The remaining cost is \$1,025.00. This statue is of significance importance to our parish which existed several decades in what is now the parking lot near the school building. It serves as a sign of our Blessed Mother's protection upon our grounds. Each year on Memorial Day area veterans and local fire companies stop before it and offer a short remembrance service. They place a wreath since the pedestal that marks those who served our country. If you would like to donate to this project, please submit a plain envelope and print MOTHER MARY on it. Checks are to

10th SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST Do You Have A Mustard Seed Size Faith? (*Mt* 17: 14-23)

Faith that is the size of a mustard seed – even faith the size of the smallest seeds – is faith that can make a tree that can change the world. A person with faith the size of such a



seed can be a full participant in God's plan. There is no minimum amount needed in order to be claimed by Christ. Your faith, no matter how weak and no matter how small is enough. So, don't be afraid to use your mustard seed faith, discover what you can do with the faith that you have, and practice using the faith that you have been given. If you do, you just might find that your tiny mustard seed faith will grow into

something truly amazing! Faith is to live by entrusting oneself to God's promises. Faith is always God's gift and never our own accomplishment. Faith is ever and only a response empowered by an amazing grace originating from outside of our own efforts that enables us to entrust ourselves willingly to One we have found trustworthy. It is especially, through word and sacrament that God bestows this faith. The words of Jesus are not meant to emphasize an extraordinary physical phenomenon. Rather the contrast between the mountain and the grain of mustard seed stresses the infinite possibilities which are open to authentic faith. It is evident here that Jesus intends our faith to be something other than a simple intellectual adherence to revealed truth. Jesus speaks of faith as being a humble and total trust in the all-powerful goodness of God. If I have but a grain of authentic faith, I can risk making that faith the basis of my life in all circumstances, confident that God will grant the true and best solutions to all my difficulties. That would be my way of removing mountains.

The importance of Sunday and Participating at the Divine Liturgy

The following article was written by a Catholic Apologist, Matt Nelson and taken from Catholic Answers Webpage. This abridges article briefly teaches us the importance of Sunday and worshipping at the Divine Liturgy. Space does not permit the entire article so you may locate it on Catholic.com/magazine.

Every Sunday "the whole Christ" is reunited in and through the Holy Eucharist. Moreover,

our choice to participate is salvific: "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you" (John 6:53). Theologian Colin Donovan reminds us that "in the Mass (Divine Liturgy) it is Christ himself who worships the Father, joining our worship to his. In no other way is it possible to adequately give thanks (eucharistia) to God . . . than by uniting our offerings to that of Jesus Christ himself." Christ does with us in the Mass (Divine Liturgy) what we cannot do alone: make a perfect offering to the Father. The key to understanding why Catholics must attend Sunday Mass (Divine Liturgy) lies above all in the essence of the Mass (Divine Liturgy) itself. Our duty to be willing participants **IS NOT rooted in how it**



makes us feel but in what it is. As the sacred meeting place of God and man, the Mass (Divine Liturgy) reorients our lives towards God, reunites us with him in love, and thereby communicates the grace of salvation to our souls. In the long run, there can be nothing more productive than that.

Saint of the Week — August 10 The Holy Archdeacon-Martyr Lawrence of Rome

Little is known about St. Lawrence (Latin: Laurentius). His Acts were lost by the time of Augustine. Legend states that he was a native of Northern Spain, who had




received instruction from St. Sixtus while he was an archdeacon in Rome. When Sixtus rose to the papacy in 257, Lawrence was ordained a deacon and was charged with the administration of ecclesiastical alms for the poor. In early August of 258, the Emperor Valerian issued an edict commanding that all bishops, priests, and deacons should be put to death immediately without trial. This command was immediately carried out throughout the city of Rome. On August 6, Pope Sixtus was arrested in the catacombs and executed with his two other deacons, Felicissimus and Agapitus. Lawrence is purported to have said as they were being led to torture, "Where are you going, Holy Father, without your son? Where, O Bishop, without

your archdeacon? Before you never approached the altar of sacrifice without your servant, and now you are going without me?" St. Sixtus was said to have prophesied that he would follow them soon after. The imperial authorities soon came to St. Lawrence to demand access to the church treasury. In the course of three days after the death of the Pope and his fellow archdeacons, St. Lawrence worked quickly to distribute as much of the ecclesiastical monies to the poor as possible. On the third day, at the head of a small tribunal, he presented himself to the prefect, and when ordered to give up the treasures of the Church, he led them to a room. There he presented the poor, crippled, and maimed, proclaiming, "Behold the jewels of the Church! The Church is truly rich, far richer, than your emperor." On August 10, St. Lawrence was perfected in holy martyrdom, grilled on a gridiron for his faith. Legend says that he was so strong-willed that, instead of giving in and releasing information to the Romans at the point of death, he cried, "I'm done on this side! Turn me over and eat!" In iconography, he is often depicted holding his gridiron.

OBLIGATORY HOLY DAY THIS WEEK — Saturday Morning (also: Friday evening), Aug. 14-15, we will be celebrating the Feast of the Dormition (Falling-Asleep) of the Mother of



God. It is the most ancient Marian Feast of the Church. It is customary to bless flowers and herbs on this day. This custom of the Church arose when the Holy Theotokos fell-asleep on Mount Zion and all of the apostles were miraculously transported back to Jerusalem with the exception of St. Thomas. Following the funeral procession along the Kidron Valley to the Gethsemane tomb, they returned to Mount Zion. Thomas later arrived and urged the apostles to take him to view and pray before the mortal remains. When then arrived at the tomb an aromatic fragrance of flowers and herbs filled the air near the spot when they laid her. Her most pure body was no longer present. Receiving a vision that she was transferred to heaven, the apostles rejoiced and

strengthened to proclaim the Good News of her beloved Son, Jesus. Following the Divine Liturgies flowers and herbs will be solemnly blessed as a thanksgiving offering. Since flowers symbolize the beauty of Eternal Life, and herbs a healing remedy for the body, you may wish to take a blessed flower and place it on the grave(s) of your loved one(s) as a symbol of faith and a prayer that they may be resting in the eternal Kingdom of heaven. **Bring flowers and herbs for this special blessing!** Check the liturgical page for the times of the Divine Liturgies.

BLESSING OF SCHOOL CHILDREN & TEACHERS NEXT WEEKEND - Following

each of the Divine Liturgies **next weekend of August 15 & 16, 2020** all Students and Teachers will be asked to come forward for a blessing as they commence the actual and/or virtual Academic Year of 2020-2021 in their various schools, colleges and universities. Since many of these institutions begin



earlier each year, the opportunity to receive this blessing comes the third weekend of August. Receive God's blessing and be enriched by His tender mercy.

CONTINUING THE SAVIOR PENITENTIAL FAST - During this fourteen-day penitential



period, the Church prescribes the Paraklis Service be held in honor of the Mother of God. The word "paraklis" has two different meanings: the first is "consolation," from which the Holy Spirit is called the "Paraclete," or "Consoler"; the second is "supplication" or "petition". The Paraklis Service consists of supplication hymns to obtain consolation and courage. It should be recited in times of temptation, discouragement or sickness. It is used more particularly during the two weeks before the Dormition of the Theotokos, from **August 1 to August 14.** The theme of this Paraklis Services centers around the petition. "Most Holy Mother of God, save us." *Following each of the*

daily Divine Liturgies we will offer a portion of this service for all our family, relatives and friends who have left our church so that they may return for the sake of their salvation. Also, as we continue in this pandemic era, we will pray the vanquishing of the coronavirus.
