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



Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. Do our beloved animal companions go to heaven when they die and will we see them again in heaven? A. Answer by Catholic Answers: Michelle Arnold: Having had a beloved pet that also had to be put to sleep, I know how difficult a pet's death can be. Unlike humans, whose souls are spirit and thus survive death, animal souls are material. That means that animals cease to exist when they die. This does not mean, however, that God cannot recreate the animal souls. Perhaps, at the end of time, when the heavens and the earth are made new (CCC 1046-1047), God will create anew the animals who were our beloved companions in this life, not because he has to but as a gift to us. Because animals do not have spiritual souls, they do not enjoy the Beatific Vision, but, perhaps, because Christ is both God and man, they may be able to interact with God made man even though they do not share in the spiritual joy reserved for spiritual creatures such as angels and saints. All of this is speculation, of course, but it is something for which we may hope.

Although mandatory Church laws have been abrogated as to its obligatory nature, it still encourages us to do penance on the days prescribed (Pure Monday & Great Friday); and NO MEAT on

Wednesdays and Fridays. Most importantly, we are all called to Fast from SIN and GIVE UP negativity by PUTTING ON virtue and being positive. Today, the Church invokes us to remember what participation in sin did — expelling Adam and Eve from Paradise. It will also keep us from entering the heavenly kingdom.


Our Holy Father's General Audience Vatican City State on "PRAYER" — February 10, 2021

Dear Brothers and Sisters: in our continuing catechesis on prayer, we now consider how our prayerful dialogue with God is meant to embrace the events of each day, in our homes, daily

chores or work. All our thoughts and activities should be a part of our daily conversation with the Lord. The Catechism teaches that "it is in the present that we encounter God, not yesterday or tomorrow, but today" (No. 2659). There is no aspect of our everyday lives, however mundane, that cannot be offered in prayer to God and become an occasion of deeper union with



him. As we come to know Christ more intimately in prayer, our hearts are expanded to embrace in love and solidarity all those around us, above all the poor, the unhappy and those in need. Blaise Pascal once observed that human beings are so frail that even a drop of water can destroy us (cf. Thoughts, No. 347). Yet in our fragility, prayer is a mark of our supreme grandeur, for prayer can work miracles in our world, transform lives and history, and serve the coming of God's kingdom of justice and peace.

Saint of the Week— February 17 The Holy & Great-Martyr Theodore Tyro

The Holy Great Martyr Theodore the Recruit (Tyro) was a soldier in the city of Alasium of the Pontine district (northeast province of Asia Minor, stretching along the coast of the Euxine, i.e., the




Black Sea), under the command of a certain Brincus. They commanded him to offer sacrifice to idols. St Theodore firmly confessed his faith in Christ the Savior in a loud voice. The commander gave him several days to think it over, during which time St Theodore prayed. They charged him with setting a pagan temple on fire, and threw him into prison to be starved to death. The Lord Jesus Christ appeared to him there, comforting and encouraging him. Brought to the governor, St Theodore boldly and fearlessly confessed his faith, for which he was subjected to new torments and condemned to burning. The martyr Theodore climbed onto the fire without hesitation, and with prayer and gave up his holy soul to God. This occurred in about the year 306 under the Roman emperor Galerius (305-311). Unharmed by the fire, the body of St Theodore was buried in the city of

Euchaita, not far from Amasium. His relics were afterwards transferred to Constantinople, to a church dedicated to him. His head is in Italy, in the city of Gaeto. Later on, fifty years after the death of St Theodore, the emperor Julian the Apostate (361-363), wanting to commit an outrage upon the Christians, commanded the city-commander of Constantinople during the first week of Great Lent to sprinkle all the food provisions in the marketplaces with the blood offered to idols. St Theodore appeared in a dream to Archbishop Eudoxius, ordering him to inform all the Christians that no one should buy anything at the marketplaces, but rather to eat cooked wheat with honey (kolyva). In memory of this occurrence, the Byzantine Catholic Church annually celebrates the holy Great Martyr Theodore the Recruit on the first Saturday of Great Lent. On Friday evening, at the Divine Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts following the prayer at the ambo, the Canon to the holy Great Martyr Theodore, composed by St John of Damascus, is sung. After this, kolyva is blessed and distributed to the faithful. *The celebration of the Great Martyr Theodore on the first Saturday of the Great Fast was set by the Patriarch Nectarius of Constantinople (381-397)*.


TIME MAGAZINE: THERE'S NO SUCH THING AS NATIONAL PRESIDENTS' DAY



HOLIDAY — By Melissa Chan: Most Americans on Monday will mark the so-called Presidents' Day holiday ... but, contrary to popular belief, on a national level there is no such thing as Presidents' Day. The federal holiday is officially called "Washington's Birthday," and it celebrates George Washington, the country's first commander-in-chief. It has kept the name since its establishment as a legal holiday in 1879, and no Congress has ever

moved to rename it "Presidents' Day," according to the Center for Legislative Archives. (It's also not a "national holiday," as that concept doesn't really exist either; in the U.S., legal holidays must be established separately by the states and the federal government.) George Washington and Martin Luther King Jr. are the only two Americans whose birthdays are federal holidays in the U.S. Washington's birthday was observed every year as a federal holiday on Feb. 22 — his recognized date of birth — up until 1968, when Congress passed a law to celebrate the first president on the third Monday in February instead. The change was part of an effort to create more three-day weekends to spur "the spiritual and economic life of the nation," Congress noted, even though that meant the holiday could technically no longer be commemorated on Washington's actual birthday. Some individual states, however, have changed the name of the holiday as it affects state employees, choosing to call it the more general name in order to honor Washington's fellow February baby, Abraham Lincoln.
