Q: Can gay marriage ever be not sinful? Also, can a priest bless a gay couple? **Answer from Tom Nash, Catholic Apologist:** No, the Catholic Church could never approve or otherwise support "same-sex" marriage, nor could a priest validly bless such a couple as a couple, irrespective of whether the pair had gone through a civil ceremony of some sort. The Church maintains its position out of love for the two persons involved as well as society in general. Authentic marriage involves the marital act, in which the two become one. Same-sex relationships involve two people of the same gender whose absence of complementarity precludes oneness sexually and otherwise as a couple. Two men are called to be brothers and two women to be sisters.

TODAY'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

By perseverance she became worthy — Gospel: Mt. 15:211-28 Commentary by St. John Chrysostom

The Canaanite woman whose daughter was tormented by a devil came to Christ begging his help. Most urgently she cried out: Lord, have pity on me. My daughter is grievously

tormented by a devil. Notice that the woman was a foreigner, a gentile, a person from outside the Jewish community. What was she then but a dog, unworthy to obtain her request? It is not fair, said the Lord, to take the children's bread and give it to the dogs. Nevertheless, by perseverance she became worthy; for Christ not only admitted her to the same noble rank as the children, dog though she was, but he also sent her away with high praise, saying: Woman, you have great faith. Let it be as you desire. Now when Christ says: You have



great faith, you need seek no further proof of the woman's greatness of soul. You see that an unworthy woman became worthy by perseverance. Now would you like proof that we shall gain more by praying ourselves than by asking others to pray for us? The woman cried out and the disciples went to Christ and said: Give her what she wants - she is shouting after us. And he said to them: I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. But when the 'woman herself, still crying out, came to him and said: That is true, sir, and yet the dogs eat what falls from their master's table, then he granted her request, saying: Let it be as you desire. Have you understood? When the disciples entreated him the Lord put them off, but when the woman herself cried out begging for this favor he granted it. And at the beginning, when she first made her request, he did not answer, but after she had come to him once, twice, and a third time, he gave her what she desired. By this he was teaching us that he had withheld the gift not to drive her away, but to make that woman's patience an example for all of us. Now that we have learned these lessons, let us not despair even if we are guilty of sin and unworthy of any favor. We know that we can make ourselves worthy by perseverance.

Pope Francis Speaks — On Christian Unity Pope's Previous General Audience at St. Peter Square in 2014

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

In these days we celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. A past year's



theme was a guestion taken from the First Letter to the Corinthians: "Has Christ Been Divided?". We know that Christ has not been divided; yet we must sincerely recognize that our communities continue to experience divisions which are a source of scandal and weaken our witness to the Gospel. In reproaching the Corinthians for their divisions. Paul reminds them to rejoice in the great spiritual gifts which they have received. His words encourage us to rejoice in the gifts God has given to other Christians, gifts which we can receive from them for our enrichment. To be able to do this calls for humility, discernment and constant conversion. As we reflect on

Paul's teaching during this Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, may we be confirmed, together with all Christ's followers, in our pursuit of holiness and fidelity to the Lord's will.

Saint of the Week Our Venerable Mother Xenia of Rome

January 24

Saint Xenia of Rome, in the world Eusebia, was the only daughter of an eminent Roman senator. From her youth she loved God, and wished to avoid



the marriage arranged for her. She secretly left her parental home with two servants devoted to her, and set sail upon a ship. Through the Providence of God she met the head of the monastery of the holy Apostle Andrew in Milassa, a town of Caria (Asia Minor). She besought him to take her and her companions to Milassa. She also changed her name, calling herself Xenia [which means "stranger" or foreigner" in Greek]. At Milassa she bought land, built a church dedicated to St Stephen, and founded a woman's monastery. Soon after this, Bishop Paul of Milassa made Xenia a deaconess. because of her virtuous life. The saint helped everyone: for the destitute, she

was a benefactress; for the grief-stricken, a comforter; for sinners, a guide to repentance. She possessed a deep humility, accounting herself the worst and most sinful of all. In her ascetic deeds she was guided by the counsels of the Palestinian ascetic, St Euthymius. The sublime life of St Xenia drew many souls to Christ. The holy virgin died in 450 while she was praying. During her funeral, a luminous wreath of stars surrounding a radiant cross appeared over the monastery in the heavens. This sign accompanied the body of the saint when it was carried into the city, and remained until the saint's burial. Many of the sick received healing after touching the relics of the saint.
