

**Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems**Q. Can a priest break the seal of confession to save lives? A. Answer by Catholic Answers Apologist Michelle Arnold: A priest cannot violate the seal of Confession for any reason whatsoever. The priest acts in persona Christi ("in the person of Christ") and in Confession the penitent is speaking to God Himself through the ministry of the priest. That means that the information given during sacramental Confession doesn't properly belong to the priest himself as a fellow human being; it belongs properly to the penitent and to God. That is one reason why the priest cannot act upon what he hears in sacramental Confession. Another reason is even more serious: If penitents have reason to fear that a priest is allowed to reveal their confessions, they won't confess. If they don't confess, they risk hell. Ultimately, the inviolability of the seal of Confession is about saving lives — it is about saving the immortal souls of those who have committed mortal sin and are at risk of eternal damnation.

### The Effects of Holy and Sanctified Water

The Catechism teaches that the sacramentals, consequently holy water, operate principally by



means of the Church's intercession (CCC 1667). The Church is the bride of the Divine Savior, and hence her prayers are always pleasing to God. When the Church prays, the divine bridegroom prays with her, and for this reason her prayer is powerful with God. Thus, it may happen that a lukewarm Christian may derive great benefit from the use of holy water. The reason for this is that God looks not on the unworthiness of mankind but rather on the prayer of the Church, so pleasing to Him. Especially, though, will the loyal children of the Church, who seek to coordinate their ideas to those of the divine Savior and of the Church, participate in the blissful effects of holy water. 1. Use holy water to drive away the

devil; 2. Use holy water to overcome temptations; 3. You can use holy water to drive away sickness – and future illness too; 4. Holy water cleanses soul from venial sins and temporal punishments; 5. Take advantage of those sanctifying effects found with holy water; and 6. Use holy water for the comfort and release of the holy souls in Purgatory.

### **Sunday after the Enlightenment**

**GOSPEL Matthew 4: 12-17** 



We are currently in the postfestive period of Holy Theophany, and it is designated to be a continuation of Our Lord Jesus' Baptism and the revelation of the Holy Trinity. This


Sunday is referred to as the "Sunday after the Enlightenment." This designation comes from the early Church from the Holy Mystery of Baptism which was referred to as the "Enlightenment." It was the usual practice to administer baptism or the enlightenment on the Theophany Feast since Jesus' own baptism was being commemorated on this important feast day. At that time catechumens who were prepared for their initiation and admission into the Church received baptism, chrismation and eucharist on that day. Therefore, this Sunday calls us to reflect on the importance of one's own baptism, and how its relevance and personal effect have called us to be God's new chosen people. What a privilege that has been



bestowed upon us! We have been satiated with Jesus' Light, and have partaken of the sanctified Jordan Water. We have been invested with Christ Himself. It is a time to ask ourselves if we have been living in accordance to His teachings and witnessing to His very presence. Our Faith goes far beyond being personal. It is to be shared with all that we come into contact with. Are you reflecting the joy of this event which promises us heavenly glory or are we like others who are depressed and saddened by the negative events that surround us? During this special year of Mercy, take this Sunday's celebration to heart and recommit yourself to Christ since He is worthy and promises eternal life and great mercy.

### The (Church) Fathers Know Best

The Early Church Fathers believed that being baptized was being born again. They



believed that being baptized was being born again. They baptized both adults and infants and they used three methods; immersion, pouring and sprinkling. **Tertullian:** "No one can attain salvation without baptism, especially in view of the declaration of the Lord, who says, "Unless a man shall be born of water, he shall not have life" (On Baptism 12:1 [A.D. 203). **Origen:** "The Church received from the apostles the tradition of giving baptism even to infants. The apostles, to whom were committed the secrets of divine sacraments, knew there is in everyone innate strains of [original] sin, which must be washed

away through water and the Spirit" (Commentaries on Romans 5:9 [A.D. 248]



### **SAINT OF THE WEEK**

### **Venerable Father Theodosius** — January 11

Theodosius was the first founder and organizer of the cenobitic way of monastic life. He was born in the province of Cappadocia in the




village of Mogarissus of devout parents. As a child, he visited St. Simeon the Stylite who blessed him and prophesied great and spiritual honors about him. With a kadilnica [censer] in which he placed unburned charcoal and incense. Theodosius sought out a place where he could settle and establish his monastery and stopped when the kadilo fired up on its own. Here, he settled and began to live the ascetical life. Soon, he gathered around him monks many of various nationalities. He built a church for each nationality so that, at the same time, services and hymns were offered to God in Greek. Armenian, Georgian, etc. But, on

the day of Holy Communion, all the brotherhood gathered in the great church in which the Greek language was used. There was a communal table for all, communal property, communal penance, communal labor, communal patience and, not too rare, communal hunger. Theodosius was an exalted model of life to all the monks; an example in labor, prayer, fasting, watchfulness and in all Christian virtues. God granted him the gift of working miracles by which he was able to heal the sick, to appear from a distance, to tame wild beasts, to discern the future and to cause bread and wheat to multiply. Prayer was on his lips day and night. He died peacefully in the Lord in the year 529 A.D., the one-hundred fifth year after his birth.

**POSTFESTIVE OF THEOPHANY** — Thursday, **January 6**, **2022**, was the *Feast of Holy Theophany*. It was the Baptism of our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ and is a **Holy Day of** 

Obligation. Remember we were obliged to attend the Divine Liturgy on that day! On this sacred Feast water was solemnly blessed. There is plenty of this this water remaining. Throughout this month, please remember to bring your own container for the newly sanctified water. Each home should have newly sanctified water. Last year's holy water is to be discarded reverently in a place that is not trampled upon. DO NOT pour it down the drain. If you find it difficult to discard bring it to the Church. The Northside has a holy sink that drains into the ground beneath the church. You are encouraged to use the newly sanctified water throughout the New Year by anointing yourself with it and even drinking it. Holy Water Fonts are now operational, and will be cleaned each week.

**HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION THIS PAST WEEK** — Just a reminder that The Feast of Holy Theophany – The Baptism of our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ, was celebrated



this past week on *January 6 was a HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION*. The Canon Law of our Byzantine Catholic Church states: ""The Christian faithful are bound by the obligation to participate on Sundays and feast days (Holy Days of Obligation) in the Divine Liturgy ...." (Canon 881#1); and "are recommended to receive the Divine Eucharist on

these days ..." (Canon 881 #3); "and should abstain from those labors or business matters which impede the worship to be rendered to God ...." (Canon 881 #4). Negligence of this church precept renders one guilty of mortal sin, therefore, unworthy to receive the Holy Eucharist, until one makes a worthy sacramental Confession of this voluntarily neglect. Please come to Confession before approaching Holy Communion.

WHY YOUR HOME SHOULD BE BLESSED EACH YEAR — Traditionally, the priest personally visits his parishioners each year to pray with them in the place where they live,

and to bless their surroundings with the newly sanctified water of Theophany. By sanctifying our home, we extend the grace of God to our individual dwellings. Just as our souls, so also our homes become tainted by the sins of those living in them and consequently lose God's protective power. We cleanse our souls of sins at least once a year and the church is blessed with the newly blessed water every so should our homes be sanctified with Holy Water to invoke blessings and protection on it and its inhabitants. As we renew
