

Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems Q. Why do we praise God? **Answer from a Catholic Apologist:** Imagine someone who never grew up being told to say thank you. After all, God could be less merciful and still be perfectly just. The praise we give to God is partly our just duty to God but also helps to keep us mindful of God's goodness and love. If we fail to appreciate God's goodness and mercy and fail to grasp

What do we mean by "Cheese-fare" and to "Give Up?

Cheese-fare Sunday indicates a farewell to dairy products just as last week's Meat-



Fare said farewell to meat products until Resurrection Sunday. As in the early Christian Church dairy products and meat were no longer eaten throughout The Great Fast Season and throughout Holy Week. Although mandatory Church laws have been abrogated as to its obligatory nature, it still encourages us to do penance on the days prescribed (Pure Monday & Great Friday); and NO MEAT on Wednesdays and Fridays. Most importantly, we are all called to Fast from SIN and GIVE UP negativity by PUTTING ON virtue and being positive. Today, the Church invokes us to remember what participation

in sin did — expelling Adam and Eve from Paradise. It will also keep us from entering the heavenly kingdom.

Our Holy Father's General Audience Vatican City State on State of Ukraine – February 23, 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters: My heart aches greatly at the worsening situation in Ukraine. Despite the diplomatic efforts of the last few weeks, increasingly alarming scenarios are opening up.

Like me, many people all over the world are feeling anguish and concern. Once again the peace of all is threatened by partisan interests. I would like to appeal to those with political responsibility to examine their consciences seriously before God, who is the God of peace and not of war; who is the Father of all, not just of some, who wants us to be brothers and not enemies. I pray that all the parties involved refrain from any action that



would cause even more suffering to the people, destabilizing coexistence between nations and bringing international law into disrepute. And now I would like to appeal to everyone, believers and non-believers alike. Jesus taught us that the diabolical senselessness of violence is answered with God's weapons, with prayer and fasting. *I invite everyone to make next 2 March, Ash Wednesday, a Day of Fasting for Peace.* I encourage believers in a special way to dedicate themselves intensely to prayer and fasting on that day. May the Queen of Peace preserve the world from the madness of war.

ST. BASIL THE GREAT ON FASTING: There is both a physical and a spiritual fast. In the



physical fast the body abstains from food and drink. In the spiritual fast, the faster abstains from evil intentions, words and deeds. One who truly fasts abstains from anger, rage, malice, and vengeance. One who truly fasts abstains from idle and foul talk, empty rhetoric, slander, condemnation, flattery, lying and all manner of spiteful talk. In a word, a real faster is one who withdraws from all evil. As much as

you subtract from the body, so much will you add to the strength of the soul. By fasting it is possible both to be delivered from future evils and to enjoy the good things to come.

Saint of the week Miracle of St. Theodore Tyro on Pure Saturday

Fifty years after the death of St Theodore, the emperor Julian the Apostate (361-363), wanting to commit an outrage upon the Christians. Knowing that Christians would be hungry after fasting through Pure Week, commanded the city-commander of




Constantinople during the first week of The Great Fast to sprinkle all the food provisions in the marketplaces with the blood offered to idols. St Theodore appeared in a dream to Archbishop Eudoxius, ordering him to inform all the Christians that no one should buy anything at the marketplaces, but rather to eat cooked wheat with honey (kolyva). In memory of this occurrence, the Byzantine Catholic Church annually celebrates the holy Great Martyr Theodore the Recruit on the first Saturday of The Great Fast. On Friday evening, at the Divine Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts following the praver at the ambo, the Canon to the holy Great Martyr Theodore, composed by St John of

Damascus, may be sung. After this, kolyva is blessed and distributed to the faithful. The celebration of the Great-Martyr Theodore on the first Saturday of The Great Fast was set by the Patriarch Nectarius of Constantinople (381-397). In imitation of this ancient custom be creative many have made this Lenten dish to strengthen them during the course of the Holy and Great 40 days Fast.





CALCULATING 40 DAYS OF LENT IN THE BYZANTINE RITE - From Pure



Monday, February 28 to Palm Friday, April 8 constitute the 40 days of the Great Fast. Holy Week is not part of the Great Fast Season. The 40 days prepare us to cleanse our souls and bodies from sin so that from Lazarus Saturday (April 9) we are made worthy to walk vicariously with Our Lord in the remaining 8 days (especially through the special liturgical

church services) we may comfort our Lord through His salutary Passion, Death, Entombment and Radiant Resurrection. Let us all individually and collectively take a more serious approach in this part of our relationship to our Awesome Triune God.
