

Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems Q. In light of the ecumenism following Vatican II, are Catholics now under serious obligation (that is, binding under pain of sin) to skip Sunday Mass once in a while and worship instead at non-Catholic churches? A. Answer by a Catholic Apologist: "Required"? "Not allowed," you mean! A Catholic may not "worship instead at non-Catholic churches." To do so is to violate the First Commandment. (This is to be distinguished from engaging in, say, an ecumenical prayer service.) It is mandatory, under pain of mortal sin but allowing for exceptions arising from necessity, for every Catholic to attend Mass (Divine Liturgy) every Sunday (or Saturday evening) and on holy days of obligation. Catholics are under no obligation to attend non-Catholic services. Such visits are purely voluntary and may be undertaken so long as no scandal is given. Vatican II's Directory on Ecumenism allows some participation at such services in common responses or hymns that are not in variance with the Catholic faith.

never get a "thank you." The Lord God, Who watches from on high, will give rewards to all who follow his golden rule. For Jesus says: "Your reward will be great and you will be the sons of the Most High, because he is kind both to the thankless and to the wicked." The second fact is that the Christian way of life is based on accomplishing extra deeds. There are too many people who desire to be just as good as their neighbors. *Jesus challenges us that we must strive to be better than the ordinary person.* It is not our neighbor with whom we must compare ourselves; it is God with Whom we must compare ourselves. The reason why we compare ourselves to God is that we are created in the image and likeness of God. By doing extra good deeds toward the church and toward our neighbor, we come closer to God. There are indeed many extra deeds that we can do. *We can pray more and attend the Divine Liturgy more often. We could also visit the sick in our hospitals and nursing homes*. So let us today follow Jesus Christ by doing the "extra."

Saints of the Week The Holy Soldier-Martyrs Sergius and Bacchus October 7

The Martyrs Sergius and Bacchus in Syria were appointed to high



positions in the army by the emperor Maximian (284-305), who did not know that they were Christians. Envious people informed Maximian that his two trusted counselors did not honor the pagan gods. This was considered to be a crime against the state. The emperor, wanting to convince himself of the truth of the accusation, ordered Sergius and Bacchus to offer sacrifice to the idols, but they replied that they honored the One God and worshiped only Him. Maximian commanded that the martyrs be stripped of the insignia of military rank (their belts, gold pendants, and rings), and then

dressed them in feminine clothing. They were led through the city with an iron chains around their necks, and the people mocked them. Then he summoned Sergius and Bacchus to him again and in a friendly manner advised them not to be swayed by Christian fables, but to return to the Roman gods. The saints refuted the emperor's words, and demonstrated the folly of worshiping the pagan gods. The emperor commanded that they be sent to the governor of the eastern part of Syria, Antiochus, a fierce hater of Christians. Antiochus had received his position with the help of Sergius and Bacchus. "My fathers and benefactors!" he said. "Have pity on yourselves, and also on me. I do not want to condemn my benefactors to cruel tortures." *The holy martyrs replied, "For us life is Christ, and to die is gain."* The enraged Antiochus ordered Bacchus to be mercilessly beaten, and the holy martyr surrendered his soul to the Lord. They shod Sergius with iron sandals with nails in their soles and sent him to another city, where he was beheaded with the sword.
