

Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. Why is it so important to go to Church? A. Answer by a Catholic Apologist: Why is it important for a lover to be with his beloved? If we love God, we will want to spend time with Him in the way He wants us to. God wants us to give ourselves to Him in worship (Col. 3:16; Eph. 5:18-19; CCC 2096). And He wants us to do it through His Son's own self-surrender and sacrifice, the Eucharist (LK. 22:17-19; CCC1389). All that requires our going to Church as God commands (Heb. 10:25). Another reason for going to Church: We receive special graces by worshipping God and by receiving the Eucharist (Jn. 6:56). Going to Church can change us and convert our hearts. It can teach us we are not the center of the universe — God is and He deserves our praise and thanksgiving (Rev. 5:12; Psalm 145:1-3; CCC 300). One more point: If we are not worshipping God, we are worshipping something else — ourselves, television, a movie star or a sports team. Not going to Church does not mean we won't worship anything, only that we will worship the wrong thing (CC 2113).

EIGHT DAYS OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY BEGINS THIS WEEK — This



Wednesday concludes the Annual Eight Days of Prayer for the intention of Christian Unity. Each year from January 18-25, Christians unite to pray in the same sentiments that Jesus prayed to the Father: "That all may be one ... so that the world may believe." (John 17:21). As Catholics we have the fullness of the faith that Jesus established, let us pray that others may be drawn into its truth. Pray each day: "O Almighty and Merciful God, You willed that the

different nations should become one people through Your Son. Grant in Your kindness that those who glory in being known as Christians may put aside their differences and become one in truth and charity, and that all men, enlightened by the true faith, may be united in fraternal communion in the one Church. In this may Your name be glorified Father, Son (+) and Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen."

A Spiritual Reflection on Today's Gospel

The Canaanite Woman Shows GREAT FAITH — GOSPEL Matthew 15: 21-28

Although the Canaanite woman comes to Jesus in humility, she speaks assertively,



saying, "have mercy on me." She seems to presume to command Jesus. She is certain not only of His divine power but also His merciful willingness to use that power to help her. Naturally, this sure faith is worked by the Holy Spirit, as Jesus comments, "you have great faith!" Interestingly, she calls Jesus "Son of David," an appellation we would expect from the Jews, not a Gentile. Her address suggests she

understands the Old Testament prophecy, which so many Jews of the flesh did not. The Gospel is expressed directly to the woman as the Lord acknowledges her faith and heals her daughter. He forgives the woman's since through her faith rather than through Jewish heredity. Indirectly, the Lord also shows mercy to the Jews present. Jesus' remark, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel," is also intended for the Jewish disciples, not for the woman only. The Jews and Christians must understand two things: (1) without Christ, we are the lost, unsaved sheep of Israel; 2) salvation through faith is for us just as it is for the woman. Although these words are more an action of the Law to convict the heart, Jesus' desire is to move His disciples to the Gospel.

Pope Francis Speaks

Summary of the Holy Father's recent words at St. Peter Square

Dear brothers and sisters: Today we view our catechesis on discernment as the process of coming to a sound understanding of the Lord's will for our lives. An



important aid to discernment is the practice of spiritual direction, in which we share with another person the movements of the Spirit in our heart and, in confronting our own frailty, draw closer to the Lord, who took upon himself and redeemed the weakness of our humanity. The Gospels speak of Jesus' many encounters with persons who opened their hearts to him and experienced his mercy and forgiveness. In conversation with a spiritual guide, we often

discern more clearly the true direction of our lives and the quiet working of God's grace in our hearts. Spiritual accompaniment also expresses the communitarian nature of our journey to perfection, since together we are members of Christ's body, sons and daughters of the Father and sharers in the life of the Spirit. As our teacher in the art of discernment we can look to the Blessed Virgin Mary, who leads us to Jesus, who urges us not to fear, but to trust in him and in his words of eternal life.

Saint of the Week — January 16

Veneration of the Precious Chains of St. Peter

. The Veneration of the Honorable Chains of the Holy Apostle Peter: In




about the year 42, on the orders of Herod Agrippa, the *Apostle Peter was thrown into prison for preaching about Christ the Savior. In prison he was held secure by two iron chains.* During the night before his trial, an angel of the Lord removed these chains from the Apostle Peter and led him out from the prison (Acts 12:1-11). Christians who learned of the miracle took

the chains and kept them as precious keepsakes. For three centuries the chains were kept in Jerusalem, and those who were afflicted with illness and approached them with faith received healing. Patriarch Juvenal (July 2) presented the chains to Eudocia, wife of the emperor Theodosius the Younger, and she in turn transferred them from Jerusalem to Constantinople in either the year 437 or 439. Eudocia sent one chain to Rome to her daughter Eudoxia (the wife of Valentinian), who built a church on the Esquiline hill dedicated to the Apostle Peter and placed the chain in it. There were other chains in Rome, with which the Apostle Peter was shackled before his martyrdom under the emperor Nero. These were also placed in the church.

WHY YOUR HOME SHOULD BE BLESSED EACH YEAR — Traditionally, the priest personally visits his parishioners each year to pray with them in the place where they live,

and to bless their surroundings with the newly sanctified water of Theophany. By sanctifying our home, we extend the grace of God to our individual dwellings. Just as our souls, so also our homes become tainted by the sins of those living in them and consequently lose God's protective power. We cleanse our souls of sins at least once a year and the church is blessed with the newly blessed water every year, so should our homes be sanctified with Holy Water to invoke God's



blessings and protection on it and its inhabitants. As we renew the insurance on our home every year, so we should renew our insurance of God's protection and His blessing which is of greater importance and more effective. If you would like to have your home blessed, please call the Church office.

THE MANY BENEFITS OF SANCTIFIED AND HOLY WATER

Because sanctified and holy water is one of the Church's sacramentals, it remits venial sin. Keep your soul beautifully pure in God's sight by making the Sign of the Cross carefully while





saying: "Wash me with hyssop and I shall become clean, cleanse me and I will be whiter than snow" (Psalm 51). Draw Blessings down on Your Loved Ones. Holy water, sprinkled with faith and piety, can move the Sacred Heart to bless your loved ones and protect them from all harm of soul and body. When worry and fear take possession of your heart, hasten to your holy water font, and give your dear ones the benefit of the Church's prayers. HOLY WATER USES: Bless Yourself and Others (family & friends) Bless Your Pets Bless Your House (especially during bad weather); Bless Your Electronics (computers, televisions, etc.); Bless Your Car, Motorcycle, and/or Boat, Bless Your Work Space; Bless the Sick and Dying Sprinkle Some on the Graves when you visit a Cemetery & also sprinkle some for the Poor Souls in Purgatory. Proper Disposal of

Holy Water: Remember to discard previous years Sanctified Water in a respectable manner such as watering your plants or place it in an area of the ground that is not walked on! It is not to be poured down the sink drain! Also, you may bring it to North Side Church to be drained in a holy sink called a Sacrarium.
