

#### Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

**Q.** Is it OK to work on Sunday? **A. Answer by a Catholic Apologist:** Rest from work is necessary. We know that even God himself rests: "he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had done" (Gen. 2:2). In recognition of this, the Church obligates us to rest on the Lord's day. The *Code of Canon Law* states, "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Mass. Moreover, they are to abstain from those works and affairs which hinder the worship to be rendered to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, or the suitable relaxation of mind and body" (CIC 1247). However, the Church also recognizes that legitimate reasons excuse from this obligation. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains, "Family needs or important social service can legitimately excuse from the obligation of Sunday rest. The faithful should see to it that legitimate excuses do not lead to habits prejudicial to religion, family life, and health" (CCC 2185).

## A Spiritual Reflection on Today's Gospel

The Canaanite Woman Shows GREAT FAITH — GOSPEL Matthew 15: 21-28

Although the Canaanite woman comes to Jesus in humility, she speaks assertively,



saying, "have mercy on me." She seems to presume to command Jesus. She is certain not only of His divine power but also His merciful willingness to use that power to help her. Naturally, this sure faith is worked by the Holy Spirit, as Jesus comments, "you have great faith!" Interestingly, she calls Jesus "Son of David," an appellation we would expect from the Jews, not a Gentile. Her address suggests she


understands the Old Testament prophecy, which so many Jews of the flesh did not. The Gospel is expressed directly to the woman as the Lord acknowledges her faith and heals her daughter. He forgives the woman's since through her faith rather than through Jewish heredity. Indirectly, the Lord also shows mercy to the Jews present. Jesus' remark, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel," is also intended for the Jewish disciples, not for the woman only. The Jews and Christians must understand two things: (1) without Christ, we are the lost, unsaved sheep of Israel; 2) salvation through faith is for us just as it is for the woman. Although these words are more an action of the Law to convict the heart, Jesus' desire is to move His disciples to the Gospel.

#### **INSPIRATIONAL WORDS TO PONDER**

When you are going through difficulty and wonder where God is REMEMBER that the Teacher is always quiet during the test!

We cleanse our souls of sins at least once a year and the church is blessed with the newly blessed water every year, so should our homes be sanctified with Holy Water to invoke God's

# .. **SAINTS OF THE WEEK — Simple Holy Day** THE THREE HOLY HIERARCHS — January 30

In the month of January, each of these saints has their own feast day. St. Basil the Great, January 1; St. Gregory the Theologian, January 25;



and the transposition of the relics of St. John Chrysostom, January 27. This combined feast day, January 30, was instituted in the eleventh century during the reign of Emperor Alexius Comnenus. At one time a debate arose among the people concerning who of the three is the greatest? Some extolled Basil because of his purity and courage; others extolled Gregory for his unequaled depth and lofty mind in theology: still others extolled Chrysostom because of his eloquence and clarity in expounding the Faith. Thus, some were called Basilians, others Gregorgians, and the third were called Johannites.

This debate was settled by Divine Providence to the benefit of the Church and to an even greater glory of the three saints. Bishop John of Euchite (June 14) had a vision in a dream: At first, all three of these saints appeared to him separately in great glory and indescribable beauty, and after that all three appeared together. They said to him, "As you see, we are one in God and there is nothing contradictory in us; neither is there a first or a second among us." The saints also advised Bishop John that he write a common service for them and to order a common feast day of celebration. Following this wonderful vision, the debate was settled in this manner: January 30 would be designated as the common feast of these three hierarchs. The Greeks consider this feast not only an ecclesiastical feast but their greatest national school holiday.
