Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. In a relationship, how far is "too far" before it is considered a sin? A. Answer by Catholic Answers: We are made in the image and likeness of God, which means we cannot treat another person as an object of pleasure (Gn 1:26). Therefore, actions that directly stimulate sexual passion are morally unacceptable (1 Tim 5:22). Our sexual gifts have a much higher and special purpose. Looser sexual behavior becomes a tyrant that keeps making more demands on those involved. Eventually, you and your date will get bored with just kissing and will most likely want to move on to other things. This is called the "law of diminishing returns." Kissing does not always give the same excitement as when you first did it. The more one feeds these passions, the more one's will becomes weakened.... Even when a man and a woman are engaged to be married, they must live chastely. The covenant and consecrated relationship begin only when enter the Holy Mystery (Sacrament) of Marriage WITH THE BLESSING OF God and the Church. The couple must reserve for marriage any expression of affection that belongs to the married life.



2ND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Come, follow me! (Matthew 4:18-23)

The second Sunday after Pentecost shows us the practical application of the great call to renunciation formulated by Jesus in the gospel for the first Sunday. The




gospel read today at the Divine Liturgy tells of the calling of the first apostles. On the shore of Lake Galilee, Jesus sees Simon and Andrew fishing. He says to them: 'Follow me'. He wants to make them fishers of men. 'And they straightway left their nets and followed him'. Further on Jesus meets James and John, also fishermen, in the company of their father, Zebedee. Jesus calls them. 'They immediately left the ship and their father and followed him.' The new disciples abandoned their nets and their ships: Jesus sometimes asks us to renounce our

profession, our instruments of work, whatever we possess. But some sons, at the call of Jesus, abandon their father too: sometimes he wants us to abandon family affections, human friendships, created love. This is not a purely negative attitude. Jesus' call has a very positive aspect: one must follow the Master. But the first apostles could not have followed the Master if they had not first of all left their ships, and their nets, and their father. And what have I abandoned in order to follow Jesus? What does he want me to leave?

Solemn Holy Day of the Week Nativity of St. John the Baptist — June 24

Six months before his appearance in Nazareth to the All-holy Virgin Mary,



the great archangel of God, Gabriel appeared to Zachariah the high priest in the Temple at Jerusalem. Before he announced miraculous conception to the unwed virgin [Mary], the archangel announced miraculous conception to the childless old [Elizabeth]. Zachariah did woman immediately believe the words of the herald of God and this is why his tongue was tied with dumbness and remained as such until eight days after the birth of John. On that day, the relatives of Zachariah and Elizabeth gathered for the young child's circumcision and for the sake of giving him a name. When they asked the father, what name he wishes to give to his son and being dumb, he wrote on a tablet: "John." At that moment his tongue became

loosed, and he began to speak. The home of Zachariah was on the heights between Bethlehem and Hebron. The news of the appearance of the angel of God to Zachariah was spread throughout all of Israel, as well as of his dumbness and the loosening of his tongue at the moment when he wrote the name "John." The news concerning this even reached Herod. Therefore, when Herod sent soldiers to slay the children throughout Bethlehem, he directed men to the hilly dwelling place of the family of Zachariah to kill John also. However, Elizabeth promptly hid the child. Enraged, King Herod sent his executioners to Zachariah in the Temple to slay him (for it happened that it was Zachariah's turn again to serve in the Temple of Jerusalem). Zachariah was slain between the court and the temple, and his blood coagulated and petrified on the stone pavers and remained a perpetual witness against Herod. Elizabeth hid with the child in a cave where she died soon after. The young child John remained in the wilderness alone under the care of God and God's angels.

FORTNIGHT FOR FREEDOM — PENNSYLVANIANS IMPLORED TO DEFEND

RELIGIOUS LIBERTY — Catholic dioceses and eparchies across the Commonwealth are planning special events to mark the second annual "Fortnight for Freedom" which will take place between June 21 and July 4. The "Fortnight for Freedom" is a time of prayer that focuses on educating Catholics about the current threats to their religious liberty. Among those threats is a provision in the Affordable Care Act which requires employers to offer contraception, sterilization and abortion inducing drugs to employees. A redefinition of marriage in which the Supreme Court rules on same-sex marriages.



Archbishop Skurla is urging all the faithful of our parishes to participate in the effort to defend religious liberty, especially by prayer. Some ways to personally participate in this event are to (1) attend the daily Divine Liturgy and receive Holy Communion for this intention during this period; (2) spend an extra 5 minutes in Church following the Divine Liturgy and (3) pray the Holy Rosary.
