

# **JESUS FEEDS 5,000**

CROWDS FLOCK TO LOCAL RABBI

Bethsaida Area officials have expressed growing concern after another incident involving a large crowd gathering around Jesus of Nazareth. Eyewitness reports suggest a crowd of well over 5.000 yesterday in a remote area outside of Bethsaida. What started out as a small crowd quickly grew as rumors of miraculous healings spread throughout the region, and everyone appears to have been fed despite limited food sources.

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

#### Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

Q. Is a priest obligated to baptize a baby even if the parents are not married or are not practicing the Catholic faith? A. Catholic Answers Apologist: If there is no reasonable assurance that after baptism the child will be raised in the faith, the priest has valid grounds for delaying the sacrament—or even refusing baptism altogether, if it is certain that the child will not receive a Catholic upbringing, something which is required by the sacrament itself. "The Church must have a well-founded hope that the baptism will bear fruit" (Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, Instruction on Infant Baptism, 1980). The Church does not take the matter of refusal of the first and most important sacrament lightly. The priest is obligated to keep in contact with the family and to attempt to secure sufficient assurances necessary for the celebration of the sacrament. Once the priest is satisfied that assurances are met, such as the choice of godparents who will be diligent in seeing that the child is raised in the faith, he cannot refuse to celebrate the sacrament without delay.


BLESSING OF SCHOOL CHILDREN & TEACHERS IN TWO WEEKS — Following each of

know where you are traveling and that there is no Catholic Church, please inform the Pastor so that a dispensation may be considered. Also, you can download an app on your cell phone called "Mass Times."

## **EIGHTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST**

Christ's Compassion: Feeding the Multitude (Matthew 14: 14-22)

The great New Testament miracle of the multiplication of the loaves reminds us of another miracle, the one performed by God's Prophet Elijah. Elijah



had told King Ahab and his wife Jezebel that God would punish the apostasy of Israel and its ruler for worshiping the heathen sun-god Baal. This punishment would be in the form of a long drought and famine. During the drought, Elijah went to Zerephath, where he was

hospitably received by a poor widow and her son, who offered him their last meal. He rewarded their charity by miraculously increasing their flour and oil - just enough each day to feed them - throughout the three-and-a-half years the famine lasted. In the churches of our metropolitan province, we are reminded of this great miracle every time that there is festive anointing - 'mirovanije' - on the occasion of special holydays. During the Vesper Service preceding the feast day, the priest blesses five loaves of bread, and the prayer of blessing mentions the miracle of the feeding of over 5,000 people. Sacramental Bread — Why did Our Lord Jesus perform this great miracle of feeding over 5,000 people? He wanted to prepare them for still another miracle, an even greater one, the one that He performed at the Last Supper, when He changed the substance of bread into His own Body. This He did when He blessed the bread, saying: "Take and eat: this is My Body," and changed the wine into His Precious Blood. He thus instituted the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, through which we today receive the spiritual nourishment necessary for our souls. Jesus Himself said: I am the Bread of Life. He who comes to Me shall never hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst." In order to unite us with Him spiritually, Our Lord enables us to receive Him every time the Divine Liturgy is celebrated, for the nourishment and salvation of our souls. May we always approach Him worthily and thank Him, collectively and personally, for this Most Precious Gift!


same Christ, really present under the species of bread and wine. Who is the offering of the Eucharistic sacrifice" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1410).

# **Saint of the Week — Aug 5**The Holy Martyr Eusignius of Antioch

The Martyr Eusignius was born at Antioch in the mid-third century. For sixty years he served in the Roman armies of the emperors Diocletian,



Maximian Hercules. Constantius Chlorus, Constantine the Great and his sons. Saint Eusignius was a companion of Saint Basiliscus (March 3 and May 22), and he provided an account of his martyrdom. At the beginning of the reign of Saint Constantine the Great. Saint Eusignius was a witness to the appearance of the Cross in the sky, a prediction of victory. Saint Eusignius retired in his old age from military service and returned to his own country. There he spent his time in prayer, fasting, and attending the church of God. So, he lived until the

reign of Julian the Apostate (361-363), who yearned for a return to paganism. During the time of Julian, two men who were arguing on the street asked him to be their judge. He dispensed justice to the correct one and the man at fault became angry and went to the emperor and accused Eusignius of being a Christian. The emperor summoned Eusignius to court but he strongly denounced the emperor for his apostasy from the Faith and reproached him with the shining example of Constantine the Great. Saint Eusignius stood trial as a Christian before the emperor Julian in the year 362. He fearlessly accused the emperor of apostasy from Christ, and reproached him with the example of his relative, Constantine the Great, and he described in detail how he himself had been an eyewitness to the appearance of the sign of the Cross in the sky. Julian did not spare the aged Saint Eusignius, then 110 years old, but ordered him beheaded.

CONTINUING THE PENITENTIAL SAVIORAL FAST PERIOD IN PREPARATION FOR THE

DORMITION FEAST — During this fourteen-day penitential period, the Church prescribes the Paraklis Service be held in honor of the Mother of God. The word "Paraklis" has two different meanings: the first is "consolation," from which the Holy Spirit is called the "Paraclete," or "Consoler;" the second is "supplication" or "petition." The Paraklis Service consists of supplication hymns to obtain consolation and courage. It should be recited in times of



temptation, discouragement, or sickness. It is used more particularly during the two weeks before the Dormition of the Theotokos, from August 1 to August 14. The theme of this Paraklis Services centers around the petition. "Most Holy Mother of God, save us." Following each of the daily Divine Liturgies we will offer a portion of this service for all our family, relatives and friends who have left our church so that they may return for the sake of their salvation.
